LEGISLATIVE SESSIONS: (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for the subject matters considered during regular legislative sessions

A JOINT RESOLUTION

2 Proposing to amend Article III, Section 2(A)(3)(b) of the Constitution of Louisiana and to 3 add Article III, Section 2(A)(5) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to provide relative 4 to legislative sessions; to provide for the subject matters considered during regular 5 sessions; to provide relative to the introduction, consideration, and enactment of 6 certain legislation in regular sessions; to provide relative to prefiling of certain 7 proposed legislation; to provide for submission of the proposed amendment to the 8 electors; and to provide for related matters. 9 Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members 10 elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of 11 Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to 12 amend Article III, Section 2(A)(3)(b) and to add Article III, Section 2(A)(5) of the 13 Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows: 14 §2. Sessions 15 Section 2.(A) Annual Session. 16 17 (3) 18 19 (b)(i) No measure levying or authorizing a new tax by the state or by any 20 statewide political subdivision whose boundaries are coterminous with the state;

13	to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on November 6,

15	Section 3. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at the election,
16	there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted
17	to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as
18	follows:
19	Do you support an amendment to allow each member of the legislature,
20	during a regular general session in an even-numbered year, to prefile up to
21	five bills that levy or authorize a new tax; increase an existing tax; or
22	legislate with regard to tax exemptions, exclusions, deductions, or credits and
23	to provide that companion bills for constitutional amendments do not count
24	toward the number of bills that a member of the legislature may file that are

Abstract: Allows each member of the legislature, during a regular general session in an even-numbered year, to prefile up to five bills that deal with certain tax matters and provides that companion bills for constitutional amendments do not count toward the number of bills that a member of the legislature may file that are outside of the applicable subject matter limitations of a regular session.

<u>Present constitution</u> provides that regular sessions convening in even-numbered years shall be general in nature and prohibits the introduction or enactment of any measure levying or authorizing a new tax or increasing an existing tax by the state or by any statewide political subdivision, or legislating with regard to tax exemptions, exclusions, deductions, or credits.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> retains <u>present constitution</u> but provides an exception to allow each member of the legislature to prefile up to five otherwise prohibited measures.

<u>Present constitution</u> provides that during regular sessions convening in odd-numbered years no matter shall be introduced or considered unless its object is to enact the General Appropriation Bill or the comprehensive capital budget, to make an appropriation, levy or authorize a new tax, increase an existing tax, levy, authorize, increase, decrease, or repeal a fee, dedicate revenue, legislate with regard to tax exemptions, exclusions, deductions, reductions, repeals, or credits, or legislate with regard to the issuance of bonds; it is a local or special law; or if it is one of no more than five general bills prefiled by a member.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides that bills to enact laws to carry into effect a proposed amendment to the constitution are not counted in determining whether a member has reached the maximum number of bills that he may file that are outside of the applicable subject matter limitations of a regular session provided in <u>proposed law</u> or <u>present law</u>.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held November 6, 2018.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on House and Governmental Affairs</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

- 1. Remove proposed provisions repealing <u>present constitution</u> provisions relative to regular sessions convening in odd-numbered years; proposed provisions repealing <u>present constitution</u> restrictions on the subject matter of items introduced or considered during a regular session; and proposed provisions making calendar and deadlines applicable to even-numbered years in <u>present</u> constitution applicable to all regular sessions.
- 2. Add provisions that allow each member of the legislature, during a regular general session in an even-numbered year, to prefile up to five bills that levy or authorize a new tax; increase an existing tax; or legislate with regard to tax exemptions, exclusions, deductions, or credits.

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3. Add provisions providing that companion bills for constitutional amendments do not count toward the number of bills that a member of the legislature may file that are outside of the applicable subject matter limitations of a regular session.
