1 A RESOLUTION

2 To commend Brayden Aime for receiving a perfect composite score of 36 on the ACT.

3 WHEREAS, Brayden Aime, a senior at French Settlement High School and resident
4 of Maurepas, Louisiana, achieved the maximum composite score, 36, on the ACT; of the
5 1.8 million students who take the test each year, only about one thousand earn a perfect
6 score; and

7 WHEREAS, Brayden is a member of the BETA Club and the varsity basketball
8 team; he has also been a member of Future Business Leaders of America and served on the
9 Students Against Destructive Decisions leadership council; and

10 WHEREAS, in 2016 he placed 3rd in Math Division I at the Louisiana Beta Club
11 Convention; Brayden also earned district and parish honorable mentions for basketball in
12 his junior year; he loves drawing and playing chess, soccer, video games, and the violin; and

13 WHEREAS, Brayden plans to attend the Massachusetts Institute of Technology or
14 Yale University to pursue a double major in computer science and mathematics and a minor
15 in international relations.

16 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
17 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby commend Brayden Aime on receiving a perfect
18 composite score of 36 on the ACT and does hereby extend to him best wishes for continued
19 success and happiness in his future endeavors.
