Amendments proposed by Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection and International Affairs to Original Senate Bill No. 127 by Senator Hewitt

## 1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

- 2 On page 1, delete line 4 and insert
- 3 "prohibitions upon certain charges to consumers; to provide certain"

## 4 AMENDMENT NO. 2

- 5 On page 1, line 13, after "W." delete the remainder of the line and lines 14 through 17 and
- 6 on page 2, delete lines 1 through 13, and insert

"A credit reporting agency may impose a reasonable charge on a consumer for initially placing a security freeze on a consumer file. The amount of the charge may not exceed ten dollars. The charge to temporarily lift the security freeze may not exceed eight dollars per request. At no time shall the consumer be charged for placing or reinstating a security freeze, or for temporarily lifting or revoking the freeze. On January first of each year, a credit reporting agency may increase the charge for placing a security alert based proportionally on changes to the Consumer Price Index of All Urban Consumers as determined by the United States Department of Labor with fractional changes rounded to the nearest twenty-five cents. An exception shall be allowed whereby the consumer will be charged zero dollars by the consumer reporting agency placing the security freeze if any of the following applies:

- (1) If the consumer is a victim of identity theft and, upon the request of the consumer reporting agency, provides the credit reporting agency with a police report described in R.S. 9:3568.
  - (2) If the consumer is sixty-two years of age or older."
