<u>Proposed law</u> (R.S. 3:2362) prohibits tying or tethering a dog or cat in a manner that exposes the dog or cat to extreme weather conditions in the following designated emergency areas:

- (1) A designated emergency area during a flood or hurricane in which a disaster or emergency, as defined in R.S. 29:723, is declared by executive order or proclamation of the governor.
- (2) A designated emergency area during a flood or hurricane in which a local disaster or emergency, as defined in R.S. 29:723, is declared by a local political subdivision of the state.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes a local governing authority to establish a fine not to exceed \$75 for violations.

Proposed law makes technical corrections to present law.

Effective August 1, 2018.

(Amends R.S. 3:2361 and 2362)

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, Aquaculture, and Rural Development to the original bill

- 1. Removes provisions prohibiting the restraint of a dog or cat in certain extreme weather conditions.
- 2. Prohibits tying or tethering a dog or cat in certain designated emergency areas during a flood or hurricane.
- 3. Removes the penalty provisions requiring a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$300.
- 4. Authorizes a local governing authority to establish a fine not to exceed \$75 for violations.
