2 To enact R.S. 32:415.3(A)(5), relative to the issuance of an ex-offender provisional driver's
3 license; to provide for a definition; and to provide for related matters.

4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

5 Section 1. R.S. 32:415.3(A)(5) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

6 §415.3. Ex-offender provisional driver's license

9 (5) For the purposes of this Section, a "person who is released from

HB 764 Engrossed 2018 Regular Session Bouie

Abstract: Defines a "person who is released from incarceration " in reference to ex-offender provisional licenses.

Present law requires the Dept of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, to issue a provisional class "E" driver's license to a person who is released from incarceration

after serving a minimum of one year and whose class "E" driver's license will be or is suspended, revoked, or cancelled for any reason upon his release.

Proposed law specifies that a "person who is released from incarceration" includes, but is not limited to, an individual who is housed in a federal residential reentry management center, also known as a halfway house.

(Adds R.S. 32:415.3(A)(5))
