SCHOOLS. Requires instruction and display of the national motto "In God We Trust" in public schools. (gov sig)

| 9  | A.(1) Not later than the 2000-2001 school year, a A program of instruction                 |
| 10 | on the flag of the United States of America shall be provided to students by the fifth     |
| 11 | grade as part of the social studies curriculum in the public elementary schools of this    |
| 12 | state. Such instruction, at a minimum, shall include the history of the American flag,     |
| 13 | etiquette, customs pertaining to the display and use of the flag, and such other           |
| 14 | patriotic exercises customs as provided by and in accordance with the provisions of        |
| 15 | 36 U.S.C. 170 et seq. on patriotic customs.                                                |
| 16 | (2) Not later than the 2019-2020 school year, the program of instruction                   |
| 17 | on patriotic customs required by this Section shall include instruction on the             |

1 national motto, "In God We Trust", and each public school governing authority 2 shall display the national motto in each building it uses and in each school under 3 its jurisdiction. The nature of the display shall be determined by each governing authority with a minimum requirement of a paper sign. 4 5 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 6 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 7 8 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 9 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 10 effective on the day following such approval.

SB 224 Re-Reengrossed

<u>Present law</u> requires instruction on the flag of the U.S. and other patriotic exercises provided by and in accordance with federal law.

<u>Proposed law</u> includes patriotic customs rather than "exercises" and requires the instruction to include information on the national motto, "In God We Trust". Additionally requires each public school governing authority to display the national motto in each building it uses and in each school under its jurisdiction.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that the nature of the display shall be determined by each governing authority with a minimum requirement of a paper sign.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
