Abstract: Increases penalties for the manufacture, production, distribution, or possession with intent to distribute heroin from a minimum of five years to a minimum of 10 years.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits any person from producing, manufacturing, distributing or dispensing or possessing with intent to produce, manufacture, distribute, or dispense, a controlled dangerous substance or controlled substance analogue classified in Schedule I, including heroin.

<u>Present law</u> provides that any person who violates this provision of <u>present law</u> with respect to heroin shall be imprisoned at hard labor for not less than five nor more than 40 years and may be required to pay a fine of up to \$50,000.

<u>Proposed law</u> amends <u>present law</u> to increase the minimum term of imprisonment for persons who violate these provisions of <u>present law</u> with respect to heroin <u>from</u> not less than five years <u>to</u> not less than 10 years.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Administration of Criminal</u> Justice to the original bill:

1. Reduce the <u>proposed law</u> minimum term of imprisonment <u>from</u> 20 years <u>to</u> 10 years for persons who violate <u>present law</u> with respect to heroin.
