4	WHEREAS, it is with great pride that the citizens and the Legislature of Louisiana
5	recognize and commend Erika McConduit on her numerous accomplishments and service
6	through the Urban League of Louisiana; and
7	WHEREAS, celebrating eighty years of service, the Urban League of Louisiana
8	(ULLA) works to enable African-American communities and other communities seeking
9	equity to secure economic self-reliance, parity, and civil rights; and
10	WHEREAS, programs of the ULLA's three centers of excellence are focused in the
11	areas of education and youth development, workforce and economic development, and
12	public policy and advocacy; and
13	WHEREAS, the ULLA touches the lives of over ten thousand Louisianians each year
14	through direct service programs in early childhood education, parent engagement, college
15	and career readiness, workforce development, economic inclusion, and civic engagement;

17	WHEREAS, the Urban League of Louisiana announced that President and Chief
18	Executive Officer Erika McConduit has resigned effective July 2018, to explore other career

WHEREAS, over the past five years, Erika McConduit served as president and chief executive officer of ULLA; and

WHEREAS, during her time, she had the privilege of serving under a dedicated board of directors, and leading an incredible team of professionals, who all worked tirelessly to breathe life into a mission of assisting African Americans and others seeking equity to secure economic parity, power, and civil rights; and

WHEREAS, Erika McConduit has worked for the ULLA for nearly a decade, first serving as vice president of programs and subsequently as executive vice president before being named president and chief executive officer in 2013, only the second woman to serve in this role in the eighty year history; and

WHEREAS, during her tenure as president and chief executive officer, Ms. McConduit achieved incredible outcomes and growth, most notably, expanding the organization from serving the Greater New Orleans area to becoming a statewide entity, with a satellite office in Baton Rouge and space agreements in surrounding parishes in Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, she also oversaw the purchase of a new twenty-six thousand square foot headquarters building in mid-city New Orleans, which also provides office and meeting space for small businesses, nonprofits, and the community at large; and

WHEREAS, under her leadership, the organization responded to crises all over the state, including flood recovery, by providing over three and a half million dollars in clothing and household goods to impacted families in the Greater Baton Rouge area, and hosted a landmark conference to commemorate the ten-year anniversary of Hurricane Katrina, also releasing a research publication examining the state of black New Orleans ten years post-Katrina; and

WHEREAS, as the president and chief operating officer of the ULLA, Erika McConduit dedicated herself to the mission of the organization, and whatever career path she chooses she will no doubt continue her legacy of changing lives throughout Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, her tenacious policy and advocacy efforts helped transform systems at

2	WHEREAS, she has played an active role ensuring a seamless transition for
3	continued success with the ULLA's work to empower communities and change lives; and
4	WHEREAS, in its eightieth anniversary year, the ULLA is strong, vibrant, and ready
5	to grow to even greater heights; and
6	WHEREAS, Ms. McConduit concluded in a letter "It has been my greatest honor to
7	have had the privilege of serving as president and CEO of such an important, effective, and
8	transformational organization as the Urban League of Louisiana. I sincerely appreciate the
9	trust and support you've given me throughout this incredible journey"; and
10	WHEREAS, both personally and professionally, she will continue to challenge
11	herself to have an even greater impact on her community and in Louisiana; and
12	WHEREAS, the success of the state of Louisiana, the strength of our communities,
13	and the overall vitality of American society depend, in great measure, upon strong, driven
14	women like Erika McConduit who pioneer change for current and future generations.
15	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
16	honor and commend Erika McConduit for her numerous accomplishments and for her
17	service as president and chief executive officer of the Urban League of Louisiana and does
18	wish her much success in all her future endeavors.
