KEYWORD AND SUMMARY AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

COASTAL PROTECT/RES AUTH. Requests the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority Board to develop a coastal master plan, at a minimum every six years. (8/1/18)

SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

1. Adds requirement that the master plan adopted pursuant to SCR 1 of the 2017 RS remain in effect through FY 2023 and then a new plan be developed and presented every six years.

DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

DIGEST

SB 432 Reengrossed

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Present law requires the CPRA board to develop a coastal master plan when necessary, or at a minimum, every five years.

Proposed law changes the five year requirement to six years.

Proposed law requires that the comprehensive master plan for integrated coastal protection projects adopted pursuant to SCR No. 1 of the 2017 RS remain in effect through FY 2023 at which time a new comprehensive master plan for integrated coastal protection projects shall be developed and presented to the legislature for adoption under the six-year renewal and revision schedule contained in proposed law.

Effective August 1, 2018.
