HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 226

PUBLIC HEALTH/OFFICE: Requests the office of public health to study and report on cancer incidence in the Colfax, Louisiana area

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the office of public health of the Louisiana Department of Health to
3	study cancer incidence in the Colfax, Louisiana area and to report findings of the
4	study to the legislative committees on health and welfare.
5	WHEREAS, with the issuance of a permit by the Louisiana Department of
6	Environmental Quality to a commercial facility for the open burning and detonation of
7	explosives from the Camp Minden Louisiana National Guard facility, Louisiana became
8	home to the largest expired munitions disposal project in the history of the United States;
9	and
10	WHEREAS, an open burn of millions of pounds of munitions per year is ongoing
11	near the central Louisiana town of Colfax; and
12	WHEREAS, open burning is a disposal method whereby hazardous waste is placed
13	in large metal trays and set on fire, releasing into the environment a multitude of toxins
14	including chlorine, lead, and perchlorate; and
15	WHEREAS, many of these toxins are known carcinogens; and
16	WHEREAS, according to the National Cancer Institute of the National Institutes of
17	Health, the American Cancer Society, and the annual America's Health Rankings report,
18	Louisiana historically has had one of the highest cancer mortality rates in the nation, and this
19	trend continues to the present day; and

1	WHEREAS, effective cancer investigation programs endeavor to improve
2	understanding of cancer incidence by geographic area and to evaluate cancer control
3	interventions; and
4	WHEREAS, as the open burn of munitions near Colfax continues, it is appropriate
5	for the legislature to call for a study of and report concerning cancer incidence in that area
6	of the state.
7	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
8	Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the office of public health of the
9	Louisiana Department of Health to study cancer incidence in the Colfax, Louisiana area.
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in conducting the study called for in this
11	Resolution, the office of public health shall engage and solicit input from agencies, research
12	institutions, and other groups with expertise in cancer research and environmental sciences
13	including but not limited to the following:
14	(1) The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
15	(2) The Louisiana Cancer Research Center.
16	(3) The Louisiana Cancer Prevention and Control Programs of the School of Public
17	Health of the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center at New Orleans.
18	(4) The Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center at Shreveport.
19	(5) The Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality.
20	(6) The Louisiana Environmental Action Network.
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the office of public health shall develop a report
22	of findings from the study called for in this Resolution, and shall submit the report to the
23	House Committee on Health and Welfare and the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare
24	no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the 2019 Regular Session of the
25	Legislature.
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
27	secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health, the assistant secretary of the office of
28	public health of the Louisiana Department of Health, the director of the United States
29	Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the chief administrative officer of the Louisiana
