Proposed law provides that the Louisiana Department of Health (LDH) shall test drinking water quality at twelve elementary schools and report its findings to the House and Senate committees on Health and Welfare.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

This measure is anticipated to have a nominal impact on the expenditures of the Office of Public Health (OPH). The measure provides that OPH shall test drinking water quality at twelve elementary schools on a testing schedule to be determined by the department. The department indicates that they will incorporate these locations into its regular testing schedule and that they will only test 2 water outlets/taps per school for elevated levels of lead. The cost for OPH to test one water sample for lead is \$32. Therefore, the total cost of testing is projected to be \$768 (12 schools x 2 water samples per school x \$32 per test). The department indicates that this cost can be absorbed through its existing budget.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
