WHEREAS, John founded the business in 1974; The Human Resource Dept., Inc., is now managed by John's son, Greg, and a team that is proud to carry on John's legacy of exceptional service through meaningful relationships; and

WHEREAS, he was a prominent figure in the Shreveport business community; Mr. Bowman was a charter member of the Southern Hills Business Association; and
