HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 231

COMMENDATIONS: Commends Joe Delpit for his outstanding accomplishments

A RESOLUTION

To commend Joe Delpit of Baton Rouge for his numerous accomplishments and contributions to the city of Baton Rouge and state of Louisiana.

WHEREAS, Joe Delpit has a rich political background; he was the first black metro councilman in Baton Rouge, and he also briefly served as mayor pro tempore; Joseph Delpit served with great honor and distinction as a member of the Louisiana House of Representatives from 1976 until 1992; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Delpit provided highly productive and effective leadership as speaker pro tempore from 1984 until 1988 as, at the time, the highest-ranking African American elected official in the state since Reconstruction and as the first African American to hold this distinguished office; Mr. Delpit was a founding member of the Louisiana Legislative Black Caucus; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Delpit served as master of ceremonies at the 1972, 1976, and 1984 inaugurations of Governor Edwin W. Edwards; he was later appointed to the Greater Baton Rouge Port Commission; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his tenure as a public servant, Joe has vast experience as a successful businessman; he has owned two health service companies, a consulting company, and an investment company; and

WHEREAS, Joe Delpit is the son of Chicken Shack founder, Thomas Delpit, who opened the business in 1935; the restaurant, which Joe has owned since 1959 and now has

1 multiple locations and a food truck, is considered to be the oldest continuously operating
2 establishment in the city of Baton Rouge; and

3 WHEREAS, at the inaugural Baton Rouge Soul Food Festival in May 2018, Joe
4 Delpit will receive the Pioneer Award for outstanding contributions to the soul food
5 industry; the recipes used at Chicken Shack have been handed down through generations;
6 and

7 WHEREAS, Joe Delpit's many notable honors include the Louisiana Education
8 Association Award, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Award, National Association for the
9 Advancement of Colored People National Freedom Award, McKinley High Alumni Award,
10 Office of Economic Opportunity Sergeant Shriver Award, *News Leader* Baton Rouge
11 Businessman of the Year Award, YMCA, Baranco-Clark Branch, Outstanding Service
12 Award, and more; and

13 WHEREAS, in 2015, Mr. Delpit was inducted into the African American Wall of
14 Fame at the New Jerusalem Baptist Church in Baton Rouge, an honor bestowed upon
15 contemporary black leaders who contribute to the growth and well-being of the community;
16 and

17 WHEREAS, former state representative and speaker pro tempore Joe Delpit of Baton
18 Rouge merits a sincere measure of commendation for his achievements and contributions
19 as a significant figure in the Baton Rouge community; and

20 WHEREAS, Joe Delpit represents all that is good about Louisiana as a man with
21 unique gifts and a dedication to community engagement; Joseph Delpit is one of this state's
22 finest sons, and he brings great pride and honor to his family, friends, and community.

23 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
24 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby commend Joe Delpit of Baton Rouge for his numerous
25 accomplishments and contributions to the city of Baton Rouge and state of Louisiana and
26 does hereby express appreciation for his efforts to serve Louisianians.

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted
28 to Joe Delpit.
