COMMENDATIONS. Commends the Destination Imagination teams from the Baton Rouge Center for Visual and Performing Arts on advancement to the Destination Imagination Global Finals.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To commend the Destination Imagination team finalists from the Baton Rouge Center for
3	Visual and Performing Arts upon their first place win at the state competition and on
4	their advancement to the Destination Imagination (DI) Global Finals.
5	WHEREAS, these young innovators are third, fourth, and fifth graders from the
6	Baton Rouge Center for Visual and Performing Arts (BRCVPA), a public elementary school
7	and part of the East Baton Rouge Parish School System Magnet Program; and
8	WHEREAS, the thirteen students who make up the teams of DI competitors took first
9	place at the state competition held March 4, 2018, in Bossier City, Louisiana; and
10	WHEREAS, this was the first DI teams ever to compete from BRCVPA and the only
11	teams from Baton Rouge to be invited to the DI Global Finals; and
12	WHEREAS, the objective of the DI experience is to produce an enlightening
13	hands-on process of learning that fosters creativity, courage, and curiosity through
14	open-ended academic situations; students learn through experimentation, the creative
15	process, and the application of STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, and
16	mathematics) principles; and
17	WHEREAS, each year Destination Imagination proposes a new set of project-based
18	challenges to an international audience of students from kindergarten to collegiate level; and

1 WHEREAS, the BRCVPA teams competed in the engineering challenge called 2 "Drop Zone" and the science challenge called "Unlikely Attraction"; and WHEREAS, in the Drop Zone challenge, students were charged with engineering a 3 4 structure that could withstand increasing amounts of weight while being dropped from ever-increasing heights, and required the structure remain as light as possible and be 5 6 incorporated into a dramatic performance; and 7 WHEREAS, the Unlikely Attraction was a science challenge that required 8 competitors to imagine a theme park situation that operated in an unexpected place and to 9 populate the park with creative attractions based in science; and 10 WHEREAS, the advantages of DI challenges are that participants learn 21st Century 11 academic skill sets along with the social skills of patience, flexibility, persistence, ethics, 12 respect for others and their ideas, and the benefits of collaborative efforts in problem-13 solving; and 14 WHEREAS, the DI Global Finals held in Knoxville, Tennessee, known as the 15 "World's Largest Celebration of Creativity", will include more than fourteen hundred teams 16 from forty-five states in the USA and fourteen foreign countries, all of whom shall compete in STEAM-themed challenges; and 17 18 WHEREAS, these competitors gain self-confidence through creativity, critical 19 thinking, team building, problem solving, risk taking, project management, and 20 perseverance; and 21 WHEREAS, the BRCVPA students have used the creative process to turn their ideas into reality and have learned invaluable life skills that are needed to succeed in school, their 22 23 future careers, and beyond. 24 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby commend the Destination Imagination team finalists from the Baton Rouge 25 Center for Visual and Performing Arts upon advancement to the Destination Imagination 26 27 Global Finals.
