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Provides relative to responsive verdicts

Proposed law amends and reenacts Code of Criminal Procedure Article 814(A) and (B) for responsive verdicts relative to crimes of theft, criminal damage to property, and the attempt to commit these offenses. Proposed law amends responsive verdicts to reflect existing penalty grades for the crimes of theft, simple criminal damage to property, and unauthorized use of a movable. Proposed law provides for responsive verdicts for violations of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law that are based upon the weight of the substance and related matters.
