<u>Existing law</u> defines a "legend drug" as any drug bearing a label required by the FDA which states: "Caution: Federal law prohibits dispensing without prescription."

<u>Existing law</u> provides that it shall be unlawful for any person to sell, deliver, or possess any legend drug except upon the order or prescription of a physician or licensed health care practitioner.

<u>Existing law</u> provides that it shall be unlawful for any person knowingly or intentionally to acquire or obtain possession of a legend drug by misrepresentation, fraud, forgery, deception or subterfuge.

New law retains these existing law crimes.

<u>Prior law</u> penalties for the commission of these <u>existing law</u> offenses included imprisonment, with or without hard labor, for not more than five years and a fine of not more than \$5,000.

<u>New law</u> reduces the penalty provisions to include imprisonment for not more than six months, a fine of not more than \$500, or both.

Effective August 1, 2018.
