Existing law (R.S. 49:950 et seq.—Administrative Procedure Act) provides procedures and requirements for adjudication proceedings by state agencies. Existing law (R.S. 49:991 et seq.) provides generally that the division of administrative law conducts adjudications. Provides procedures, requirements, and exceptions.

Existing law (R.S. 49:964 and 992) generally authorizes a person who is aggrieved by a final decision or order in an adjudication proceeding to seek judicial review. However, prohibits an agency from seeking judicial review.

New law provides an exception to authorize the Dept. of Children and Family Services to seek judicial review in appeals brought pursuant to existing law (Ch. C. Art. 616.1.1) involving reports alleging abuse or neglect.

Effective upon signature of governor (May 10, 2018).
