Abstract: Adds to the rules, regulations, and standards for licensing of hospice care facilities and implements regulations regarding the issuance of permits to nonlicensed persons.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the administration of <u>present law</u> is vested in La. Dept. of Health (LDH) and that LDH shall promulgate rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of <u>present law</u> in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the promulgation of rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act as it relates to <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "otherwise-qualified nonlicensed person" to mean an ex-offender with a certificate of completion from a community-based hospice licensed by the department, who has been convicted of an offense or offenses, except for a sex offense as defined by R.S. 15:541.

<u>Proposed law provides</u> that LDH shall issue permits to otherwise-qualified nonlicensed persons who provide, for compensation, nursing care or other health-related services directly related to patient care to residents in, or patients of, a hospice agency, and to any person who provides such services to individuals in their own homes as an employee or contract provider of a hospice.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that an otherwise-qualified nonlicensed person may apply to the department for a permit to provide nursing care or other health-related services to a hospice agency or hospice. LDH shall issue the permit for which the applicant applied and is otherwise qualified to receive.

Proposed law provides for the training required for an otherwise-qualified nonlicensed person.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that LDH shall approve a program curriculum for an otherwise-qualified nonlicensed person.
