2	To amend and reenact R.S. 12:426(A), relative to electricity cooperatives; to provide with
3	respect to the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission; and to provide for
4	related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 12:426(A) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
7	§426. Jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission
8	A. Cooperatives transacting business in this state pursuant to this Part shall
9	not be subject to the jurisdiction and control of the Public Service Commission
10	except as provided in R.S. 45:1163 and Subsections B and C of this Section.

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Abstract: Provides with respect to the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission as it relates to electricity cooperatives.

<u>Present law</u> provides that cooperatives that transact business in the state shall <u>not</u> be subject to the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission (PSC) except as it relates to the authority to regulate rates and unless the members hold a referendum election to determine otherwise pursuant to <u>present law</u>.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Proposed law changes present law</u> by providing that cooperatives transacting business in the state <u>shall</u> be subject to the jurisdiction of the PSC except as it relates to the authority to regulate rates and unless the members hold a referendum election to determine otherwise pursuant to <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a petition of at least ten percent of the members of an electric cooperation is necessary in order to hold a referendum election to determine whether the electric cooperative shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the PSC.

Proposed law retains present law.
