Amendments proposed by House Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works to Original House Bill No. 558 by Representative Hodges

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 Delete Amendment #2546 by the House Committee on Transportation, Highways, and  
3 Public Works in its entirety.

4 AMENDMENT NO. 2

5 On page 1, line 2, after "reenact" delete the remainder of the line and insert "R.S. 38:90.2(A),  
6 relative to"

7 AMENDMENT NO. 3

8 On page 1, line 3, after "Commission;" delete the remainder of the line and delete line 4 in  
9 its entirety and insert "to provide relative to the membership of the commission;"

10 AMENDMENT NO. 4

11 On page 1, line 7, after "Section 1." delete the remainder of the line and insert "R.S.  
12 38:90.2(A) is hereby"

13 AMENDMENT NO. 5

14 On page 1, delete lines 9 through 20 in their entirety and insert the following:

15 "§90.2. Revision of flood information database by the Floodplain Evaluation  
16 and Management Commission

17 A. Provided that sufficient funds are specifically appropriated to the office,  
18 no later than March 1, 2022, and at least once every five years thereafter, the  
19 Floodplain Evaluation and Management Commission, consisting of the Department  
20 of Transportation and Development, the Coastal Protection and Restoration  
21 Authority, the office of community development, the Governor's Office of Homeland  
22 Security and Emergency Preparedness, the Department of Environmental Quality,  
23 a member of the Association of Levee Boards of Louisiana, a member from the  
24 House Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works, a member from  
25 the Senate Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works, and the  
26 secretary of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries or his designee shall review  
27 and revise the statewide flood information database. The secretary of the  
28 Department of Transportation and Development or his designee shall serve as  
29 chairman of the commission. The database will be developed for the purpose of the  
30 systematic evaluation of drainage and flooding problems in the state. The  
31 commission shall review the development proposals in each area to ensure that no  
32 development in one parish or municipality will have a negative or detrimental effect  
33 in any other parish or municipality. In addition, the commission shall ensure that  
34 maintenance in any basin area across parish or municipal boundaries, including the  
35 clearing and de-snagging of the Amite and Comite Rivers, are performed according  
36 to any contractual obligations and state law.
