CRIME: Provides for fines associated with selling vapor products to persons under the age of $18\,$

DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> prohibits the sale and distribution of any tobacco product, alternative nicotine product, or vapor product to persons under the age of 18, and prohibits persons under the age of 18 from buying such products.

<u>Present law</u> provides that whoever violates <u>present law</u> by selling or buying tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products shall be subject to the following fines:

- (1) For a first violation a fine of up to \$50.
- (2) For a second violation a fine of up to \$100.
- (3) For a third violation a fine of up to \$250.
- (4) For subsequent violations a fine of up to \$400.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for increased fines for sellers who violate <u>present law</u> with respect to all tobacco products including vapor products:

- (1) For a first violation a fine of up to \$500.
- (2) For a second violation a fine of up to \$750.
- (3) For subsequent violations a fine of up to \$1,000.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Administration of</u> Criminal Justice to the original bill

1. Amend <u>proposed law</u> to provide that the increase in <u>present law</u> fines apply only to sellers of vapor products to persons under the age of 18.

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill

- 1. Decrease the proposed law second violation fine from \$1,000 to \$750.
- 2. Decrease the proposed law subsequent violation fine from \$2,500 to \$1,000.
- 3. Make technical corrections.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

<u>Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary C to the reengrossed bill</u>

1. Make penalty provisions of proposed law applicable to all tobacco products.
