9	maintenance, or operation of a motor vehicle, failure to wear a safety belt in
10	violation of this Section shall not may be considered evidence of comparative
11	negligence. Failure to wear a safety belt in violation of this Section shall not be
12	admitted to mitigate damages.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits consideration of the failure to wear a safety belt in violation of law as evidence of comparative negligence in any action to recover damages arising out of the ownership, common maintenance, or operation of a motor vehicle.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits admission of the failure to wear a safety belt in violation of law to mitigate damages.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes <u>present law</u> to allow consideration of evidence of failure to wear a safety belt in an action to recover damages arising from a motor vehicle accident as comparative negligence and removes provisions prohibiting its admission to mitigate damages.

Effective August 1, 2020.
