SB 191 Original

<u>Present law</u> defines the term "public records" and provides for exemptions to the public records law.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any personally identifiable information of any person whose information is submitted to the Department of Economic Development (department) pursuant to a contract with the department for any purpose or for any program, including but not limited to any incentive or loan forgiveness program shall be confidential and shall not be subject to the Public Records Law.
