<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if, for reasons of force majeure or other catastrophic event, 50% or more of a qualified truck stop facility is destroyed and must be rebuilt according to certain local, state, or federal building code standards which would inhibit the facility's ability to meet the fuel requirements of <u>present law</u>, such qualified truck stop facility that has been in operation for 10 or more years and has maintained fuel sales in compliance with the <u>present law</u>, is required to offer fuel, but may apply to the La. Gaming Control Board for a waiver of the fuel requirements as set forth in <u>present law</u>.

Effective August 1, 2020.
