<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> establishes a state minimum hourly wage and provides for gradual increases.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> requires that, effective Aug. 1, 2021, every employer with 50 or more full-time employees pay to each employee 18 years of age and older at least the state minimum hourly wage of \$11 per hour or the federal minimum wage, whichever is higher.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides that beginning Aug. 1, 2023, the state minimum hourly wage shall be \$13 per hour or the federal minimum wage, whichever is higher.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment provides that beginning Aug. 1, 2025, the state minimum hourly wage shall be \$15 per hour or the federal minimum wage, whichever is higher.</u>

Specifies submission of the amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held on November 3, 2020.
