ENVIRONMENT: Reinstates the Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund and program

1 AN ACT

2 To reenact R.S. 30:2551 and 2552(A) and (C), to amend and reenact R.S. 30:2552(B) and
3 Section 22 of Act No. 612 of the 2018 Regular Session, and to repeal R.S.
4 30:2552(A), (B), and (C) as amended by Section 9 of Act No. 612 of the 2018
5 Regular Session, relative to brownfields cleanup and redevelopment; to reinstate the
6 Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund and program; to provide an effective
7 date; and to provide for related matters.

8 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

9 Section 1. R.S. 30:2551 and 2552(A) and (C) are hereby reenacted and R.S.
10 30:2552(B) is hereby amended and reenacted as follows:

11 §2551. Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund; purpose

12 A. The legislature finds and declares that the cleanup, redevelopment, and
13 reuse of brownfields sites in the state should be encouraged and facilitated for the
14 benefit of the state's citizens by way of economic development, health, and
15 aesthetics. The legislature further finds and declares that providing loans for cleanup
16 of brownfields sites will result in benefits to the public by reducing risk to public
17 health and the environment.

18 B.(1) In furtherance of that purpose, there is hereby established a fund in the
19 state treasury to be known as the "Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund"
20 hereafter referred to as the "fund", which shall be maintained and operated by the

1 Department of Environmental Quality. Grants from the federal government or its
2 agencies allotted to the state for the capitalization of the fund and state funds when
3 available shall be deposited directly in or credited to the account of the fund in
4 compliance with the terms of the federal or state grant or state appropriation.

5 (2) Money in, credited to the account of, or to be received by the fund shall
6 be expended in a manner consistent with terms and conditions of the grants and other
7 sources of said deposits and credits and of all applicable federal and state legislation
8 and may be used:

9 (a) To make loans from the fund at or below market interest rates.

10 (b) To provide assistance to a political subdivision, public trust, quasi
11 governmental organization, or eligible nonprofit or private entity to remediate
12 eligible brownfields' properties, except as provided in Subsection C of this Section.

13 (c) To fund other brownfields-related programs authorized by the terms of
14 the grants and appropriations.

15 (d) To fund other programmatic activities of the department to develop and
16 operate the revolving loan program.

17 (e) To provide for any other expenditure consistent with the federal grant
18 program and state law.

19 (3) Money not currently needed for the operation of the fund or otherwise
20 dedicated may be invested in an interest bearing account. All such interest earned
21 on investments shall be credited to the fund.

22 C. Responsible persons shall not be eligible to apply for or receive loans
23 pursuant to this Part.

24 D. The fund shall be administered by the department, which is authorized to
25 enter into contracts and other agreements in connection with the operation of the
26 fund. The department shall maintain full authority for the operation of the fund in
27 accordance with applicable federal and state law.

1 E. Prior to making a loan, the department shall determine that the applicant
2 has the ability to repay the loan. Further, the department may require security for
3 loans made pursuant to this Part.

4 F. The secretary is authorized to adopt rules and regulations in accordance
5 with the Administrative Procedure Act to implement the provisions of this Part.
6 These rules shall include but not be limited to:

7 (1) Eligibility requirements of the entity or person and properties.

8 (2) Criteria for ranking and selecting applicants.

9 (3) Procedures for making and repaying loans.

10 (4) Requirement of security for loans to eligible non-profits and private
11 entities.

12 (5) Establishment of procedures for interest rates on loans.

13 G. As used in this Part, the following terms shall have the meaning ascribed
14 to them in this Subsection, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

15 (1) "Brownfields site" means real property, the expansion, redevelopment,
16 or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a
17 hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant.

18 (2) "Loan" means a loan of money from the Brownfields Cleanup Revolving
19 Loan Fund.

20 (3) "Nonprofit organization" means any corporation, trust, association,
21 cooperative, or other organization that is operated primarily for scientific,
22 educational, service, charitable, or similar purpose in the public interest; is not
23 organized principally for profit; and uses net proceeds to maintain, improve, or
24 expand the operation of the organization.

25 (4) "Responsible person" means responsible person or responsible owner as
26 those terms are defined in R.S. 30:2285.2.

27 H. The department shall provide an annual report of all loans made, a status
28 of loan repayments, and a report of monies expended from the fund to the House

1 Committee on Natural Resources and Environment and the Senate Committee on
2 Environmental Quality.

3 §2552. Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund Program; authority to make
4 loans and grants; incur debt; tax exemption

5 A. Any political subdivision, public trust, quasi governmental organization,
6 or eligible nonprofit or private entity, except as provided in R.S. 30:2551(C), is
7 hereby authorized to make loans from and incur debt payable to the department in
8 accordance with the provisions of this Section. The making of a loan from the
9 Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund and the issuance of debt evidencing such
10 loan by any political subdivision, eligible nonprofit organization, or eligible private
11 entity shall be approved by the State Bond Commission. This Section shall not be
12 deemed to be the exclusive authority under which a political subdivision, eligible
13 nonprofit organization, or eligible private entity may borrow money from or incur
14 indebtedness to the department. The department shall aggressively pursue
15 leveraging of all funds to the maximum amount allowable by law.

16 B. All bonds, notes, or other evidence of indebtedness of any political
17 subdivision, public trust, quasi governmental organization, or eligible nonprofit or
18 private entity issued to represent a loan from the department or the fund shall be
19 authorized and issued pursuant to a resolution of the governing authority of such
20 entity, which resolution shall prescribe the form and details thereof, including the
21 terms, security for, manner of execution, repayment schedule, and redemption
22 features thereof, and such resolution may provide that an officer of such entity may
23 execute in connection with such obligation any related contract, including but not
24 limited to a credit enhancement device, indenture of trust, loan agreement, pledge
25 agreement, or other agreement or contract needed to accomplish the purposes for
26 which ~~said~~ the evidence of indebtedness is given, in substantially the form attached
27 to said resolution, but which final executed credit enhancement device, indenture of
28 trust, loan agreement, pledge, or other contract or agreement may contain such
29 changes, additions, and deletions as shall in the sole opinion of the executing officer

1 be appropriate under the circumstances. Any such resolution shall include a
2 statement as to the maximum principal amount of any such obligation, the maximum
3 interest rate to be incurred or borne by ~~said~~ the obligation or guaranteed by ~~said~~ the
4 obligation, the maximum redemption premium, if any, and the maximum term in
5 years for such obligation, guarantee, or pledge.

6 C. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a political
7 subdivision, public trust, quasi governmental organization, or eligible nonprofit
8 entity, upon entering into a loan in accordance with the fund as provided in R.S.
9 30:2551, may dedicate and pledge a portion of any revenues it has available to it,
10 including but not limited to revenues from the general revenue fund, sales taxes,
11 assessments, or property taxes of the political subdivision, for a term not exceeding
12 twenty years from the date of project completion for repayment of the principal of,
13 interest on, and any premium, administrative fee, or other fee, or cost imposed by the
14 department in connection with such loan.

 10 of the 2013 Regular Session of the Legislature are hereby repealed in their entirety.
 11 Section 3. R.S. 30:2552(A), (B), and (C) as amended by Section 9 of Act No. 612
 12 of the 2018 Regular Session are hereby repealed.

13 Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
 14 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
 15 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
 16 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
 17 effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Reinstates the Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund and program.

Act 612 of the 2018 Regular Session abolished several funds in the state treasury. One of those funds was the Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund. The Act also abolished the program associated with that fund.

Proposed law reinstates the fund and program.

(Re-enacts R.S. 30:2551 and 2552(A) and (C) Amends R.S. 30:2552(B) and Section 22 of Act No. 612 of the 2018 R. S.; Repeals R.S. 30:2552(A), (B), and (C) as amended by Section 9 of Act No. 612 of the 2018 R.S.)
