CORONERS. Requires the coroner to issue a permit for cremation after completion of coroner's investigation of death when under suspicious circumstances or the reasonable probability of the commission of a crime. (8/1/20)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 13:5716, relative to coroners; to provide for cremation of bodies;
3	to provide for notification; to provide for an investigation; to provide for a permit;
4	and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 13:5716 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
7	§5716. Cremation of bodies
8	If the cremation of a body is requested, the funeral director shall immediately
9	notify the coroner who has jurisdiction in the death.
10	$\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ . If, after the necessary investigation, the coroner is satisfied that there are
11	no suspicious circumstances surrounding the death, he shall issue a permit for
12	cremation.
13	<b><u>B.</u></b> If the investigation reveals suspicious circumstances or the reasonable
14	probability of the commission of a crime, the coroner shall deny the permit. After
15	completion of the coroner's investigation, he may issue a permit for cremation.

<u>Present law</u> requires that if the cremation of a body is requested, the funeral director immediately notify the coroner who has jurisdiction in the death.

<u>Present law</u> requires that after the necessary investigation, the coroner issue a permit for cremation if he is satisfied that there are no suspicious circumstances surrounding the death.

<u>Present law</u> requires that the coroner deny the permit if the investigation reveals suspicious circumstances or the reasonable probability of the commission of a crime.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and authorizes that in instances where the investigation reveals suspicious circumstances or the reasonable probability of the commission of a crime, the coroner to issue a permit for cremation after the coroner's investigation is complete.

Effective August 1, 2020.
