MTR VEHICLE/VIOLATIONS: Provides relative to the operation of a motor vehicle while using wireless telecommunication devices

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 32:300.5 and to repeal R.S. 32:300.6, 300.7, and 300.8, relative 3 to the prohibition of the use of certain wireless telecommunications devices while 4 operating a motor vehicle; to provide for definitions; to provide for exceptions and 5 penalties relative to the use of certain wireless telecommunications devices while 6 operating a motor vehicle; and to provide for related matters. 7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 8 Section 1. R.S. 32:300.5 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 9 §300.5. Use of certain wireless telecommunications devices for text messaging and 10 social networking prohibited 11 A.(1) Except as provided in Subsection B of this Section, no person shall 12 operate any motor vehicle upon any public road or highway of this state while using 13 a wireless telecommunications device to write, send, or read a text-based 14 communication. For purposes of this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be 15 writing, reading, or sending a text message if the person reads, selects, or enters a 16 telephone number or name in a wireless telecommunications device for the purpose 17 of making a telephone call. 18 (2) No person shall operate any motor vehicle upon any public road or 19 highway of this state while using a wireless telecommunications device to access, 20 read, or post to a social networking site.

(3)(a) "Wireless telecommunications device" means a cellular telephone, a
text-messaging device, a personal digital assistant, a stand alone computer, or any
other substantially similar wireless device that is readily removable from the vehicle
and is used to write, send, or read text or data through manual input. A "wireless
telecommunications device" shall not include any device or component that is
permanently affixed to a motor vehicle. It does not include citizens band radios,
citizens band radio hybrids, commercial two-way radio communication devices, two-
way radio transmitters or receivers used by licensees of the Federal Communication
Commission in the Amateur Radio Service, or electronic communication devices
with a push-to-talk function.
(b) "Write, send, or read a text-based communication" means using a
wireless telecommunications device to manually communicate with any person by
using a text-based communication referred to as a text message, instant message, or
electronic mail.
(c) "Access, read, or post to a social networking site" means using a wireless
telecommunications device to access, read, or post on such device to any web-based
service that allows individuals to construct a profile within a bounded system,
articulate a list of other users with whom they share a connection, and communicate
with other members of the site.
B. The provisions of Paragraph (A)(1) of this Section shall not apply to the
following:
(1) Any law enforcement officer, firefighter, or operator of an authorized
emergency vehicle while engaged in the actual performance of his official duties.
(2) An operator of a moving motor vehicle using a wireless
telecommunications device to:
(a) Report illegal activity.
(b) Summon medical or other emergency help.
(c) Prevent injury to a person or property.

1	(d) Relay information between a transit or for-hire operator and that
2	operator's dispatcher, in which the device is permanently affixed to the
3	vehicle.
4	(e) Navigate using a global positioning system.
5	(3) A physician or other health care provider using a wireless

9	C.(1) The first violation of the provisions of this Section shall be punishable
10	by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars.

12	one thousand dollars.
13	(3) If the person is involved in a crash at the time of violation, then the fine
14	shall be equal to double the amount of the standard fine imposed in this Subsection
15	and the law enforcement officer investigating the crash shall indicate on the written
16	accident form that the person was using a wireless telecommunications device at the
17	time of the crash.
18	(4) Any violation of this Section shall constitute a moving violation.

7	operator of an authorized emergency vehicle.
8	D.(1) Any violation of this Section shall constitute a moving violation.
9	(2)(a) The first violation of the provisions of this Section shall be punishable
10	by a fine of not more than five one hundred dollars or less than twenty-five dollars.
11	(b) Each subsequent The second violation shall be punishable by a fine of
12	not more than one thousand three hundred dollars and a suspension of driver's license
13	for a sixty-day period but not less than one hundred dollars.
14	(c) The third violation shall be punishable by a fine of not more than three
15	hundred dollars but not less than one hundred dollars and shall include the
16	suspension of the person's driver's license for a period of thirty days.
17	(c)(d) If a person the operator of a motor vehicle is involved in a collision
18	<u>crash</u> at the time of the violation, then the fine shall be equal to double the amount
19	of the standard fine imposed in this Subsection. and the The law enforcement officer
20	investigating the collision crash shall indicate on the written accident report that the
21	person operator of a motor vehicle was using a wireless telecommunications device
22	at the time of the collision crash.
23	(3) It <u>Use of a wireless telecommunications device for any purpose provided</u>
24	for in Subsection C of this Section shall be an affirmative defense against an alleged
25	to a violation of this Section in support of which for the operator of a motor vehicle
26	person to may produce documentary or other evidence that the wireless
27	telecommunications device that is the basis of the alleged violation was used for
28	emergency purposes as provided in Subsection C of this Section.

1	(4) For any violation occurring before January 1, 2021, the law enforcement
2	officer shall only issue a written warning.
3	E. The provisions of this Section shall only apply within a school zone upon
4	a public road or highway during posted hours when signs are located in a visible
5	manner in each direction that indicate the use of a hand-held wireless
6	communications device is prohibited while operating a motor vehicle.
7	A law enforcement officer shall not do any of the following based solely on
8	a violation of this Section:
9	(1) Seize, search, view, or require the forfeiture of a wireless
10	telecommunications device.
11	(2) Search or request to search a motor vehicle, motor vehicle operator, or
12	passenger.
13	(3) Make a custodial arrest except upon a warrant issued for failure to appear
14	in court when summoned or for failure to pay an imposed fine.
15	Section 2. R.S. 32:300.6, 300.7, and 300.8 are hereby repealed in their entirety.

Abstract: Prohibits the use of a wireless telecommunications device while operating a motor vehicle, and provides for exceptions and penalties for such use.

Present law prohibits the use of wireless telecommunications devices in school zones.

Proposed law extends the prohibition to include general usage of wireless telecommunications devices while driving.

Present law defines the term "engage in a call" as talking or listening on a wireless telecommunications device.

Proposed law modifies present law by defining the term "engage in a call" as talking or listening during a voice transmission on a wireless telecommunications device or manually entering names or phone numbers to initiate a call.

Present law specifies that a "wireless telecommunications device" does not include any device or component that is permanently affixed to a motor vehicle, a hands-free wireless telephone, an electronic communication device used hands-free, citizen band radios, citizen band radio hybrids, commercial two-way radio communication devices, two-radio

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transmitters or receivers used by licensees of the Federal Communication Commission in the Amateur Radio Service, or electronic communication devices with push-to-talk functions.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by adding that a "wireless telecommunications device" also does not include any other electronic device or any other substantially similar portable wireless device used to create, edit, or view video or other images. <u>Proposed law</u> modifies present law by removing a hands-free wireless telephone from the exclusion.

<u>Present law</u> defines the term "write, send, or read a text-based communication" as using a wireless telecommunications device to manually communicate with any person by text-based communication including but not limited to a text message, instant message, or electronic mail.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by defining the term "write, send, or read a text-based communication" to include other text-based applications used to manually communicate with any person and removes the use of a wireless telecommunications device to manually communicate with any person by text-based communication.

<u>Present law</u> specifies that operating a wireless telecommunications device includes engaging in a call; writing, sending, or reading a text-based communication; and accessing, reading, or posting to a social networking site.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds to <u>present law</u> accessing, viewing, posting, editing, or creating a video, photograph, or other image; accessing, reading, viewing, composing, browsing, transmitting, saving, or retrieving electronic data from any application other than media; using any application or feature of such a device by making manual entries of letters, numbers, symbols, or any combination thereof; and holding or physically supporting a wireless telecommunications device in either or both hands or with any part of the body, except for an earpiece, headphone device, or a wrist device to talk or listen during a voice transmission.

<u>Proposed law provides exceptions for operating a wireless telecommunications device while</u> operating a motor vehicle upon any public road or highway for law enforcement officers, firefighters, and operators of authorized emergency vehicles.

<u>Present law</u> provides exceptions for operating a wireless telecommunications device while operating a motor vehicle upon any public road or highway for a person who uses a wireless telecommunications device: to report a traffic collision, medical emergency, or serious road hazard; to report a situation in which the person believes his personal safety is in jeopardy; to report or avert the perpetration or potential perpetration of a criminal act against the driver or another person; or while the motor vehicle is parked.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies the exception in <u>present law</u> by specifying that it applies to a person using a wireless telecommunications device: to report other emergencies; to report a situation in which the person believes that an individual is in jeopardy of serious injury or death; to relay information between a transit or for-hire operator, including a transportation network company driver, and that operator's dispatcher, in which the device is affixed to the vehicle; to view data or images to navigate using a hands-free global positioning system; and to operate a device for a purpose other than texting while the motor vehicle is lawfully stationary and not in violation of any other law. <u>Proposed law</u> removes the exceptions for a person using a wireless telecommunications device to: report a situation in which the person believes their personal safety is in jeopardy or to report or avert the perpetration or potential perpetration of a criminal act against the driver or another person.

Present law requires the first violation be punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.

<u>Proposed law modifies present law</u> by reducing the fine for a first violation <u>from</u> \$500 <u>to</u> a fine of \$100 but not less than \$25.

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<u>Present law</u> requires each subsequent violation be punishable by a fine of not more than \$1000 and a 60-day driver's license suspension.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> to provide that a second violation is punishable by a fine of \$300 but not less than \$100. <u>Proposed law</u> requires the third violation be punishable by a fine of not more than \$300 but not less than \$100 and to include a 30-day driver's license suspension.

<u>Present law</u> requires a person involved in a collision at the time of the violation to be fined double the amount of the standard fine imposed. <u>Present law</u> requires the law enforcement officer investigating the collision to indicate on a written report that the person was using a wireless telecommunications device at the time of the collision.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies the double fine imposed in <u>present law</u> to be designated for the operator of a motor vehicle involved in a crash at the time of the violation.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires law enforcement officers to issue a written warning for any violation occurring before Jan. 1, 2021.

<u>Present law</u> establishes an affirmative defense against an alleged violation of <u>present law</u> by allowing the person to produce documentary or other evidence that the wireless telecommunications device that is the basis of the alleged violation was used for emergency purposes as provided for in present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits law enforcement, based solely on a violation of this law, from doing any of the following: seizing, searching, viewing, or requiring the forfeiture of a wireless telecommunications device; searching or requesting to search a motor vehicle, motor vehicle operator, or passenger; and making a custodial arrest except upon a warrant issued for failure to appear in court when summoned or for failure to pay an imposed fine.

<u>Present law</u> specifies that the provisions of <u>present law</u> only apply within a school zone upon a public road or highway during posted hours when signs are located in a visible manner in each direction that indicate the use of a hand-held wireless communications device is prohibited while operating a motor vehicle.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals <u>present law</u> and makes prohibitions applicable to intrastate travel subject to enumerated exceptions.
