2	To urge and request the Broadband for Everyone in Louisiana Commission to create and
3	provide broadband maps, in cooperation and coordination with the Federal

6	WHEREAS, in the modern economy, rural broadband is a lifeline to quality of life
7	and economic opportunity; and
8	WHEREAS, while broadband high-speed internet service is abundantly available in
9	Louisiana cities, it is woefully absent in the rural areas of the state; and
10	WHEREAS, according to the United States Department of Agriculture, eighty
11	percent of the twenty-four million American households who lack reliable and affordable
12	high-speed internet are in rural areas; and
13	WHEREAS, the federal government, though the United States Department of
14	Agriculture, is currently making investments in broadband infrastructures to help transform
15	rural America, providing innovation and technology to increase economic competitiveness
16	and opportunities; and

1 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Agriculture currently provides loans 2 and grants to increase high-speed internet access in rural areas; and 3 WHEREAS, a reliable and accurate mapping of current broadband access and 4 activation gaps is critical to effectively utilizing these resources; and 5 WHEREAS, the currently available broadband maps have proven to be unreliable 6 and inaccurate; and 7 WHEREAS, a local approach to mapping will provide better information for 8 Louisiana residents and businesses to use in order to have access to broadband services. 9 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 10 urge and request the Broadband for Everyone in Louisiana Commission within the office of 11 the governor to create and provide broadband maps, in cooperation and coordination with 12 the Federal Communications Commission's efforts, to identify access and activation gaps. 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the broadband maps requested by this 14 Resolution be submitted to the House Committee on Commerce and the Senate Committee 15 on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and International Affairs on or before January 1, 2021. 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the 17 Broadband for Everyone in Louisiana Commission within the office of the governor.
