13	"Section 1. R.S. 27:302 and 304 are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
14	27:306 through 313 are hereby enacted to read as follows:
15	§302. Definitions
16	For purposes of this Chapter:
17	(1) "Board" means the Louisiana Gaming Control Board.
18	(2) "Confidential information" means information related to the play of a
19	fantasy sports contest by fantasy sports contest players that is obtained as a result of
20	or by virtue of a person's employment.
21	(3) "Entry fee" means cash or cash equivalent that is required to be paid by
22	a fantasy sports contest participant to a fantasy sports contest operator in order to
23	participate in a fantasy sports contest.
24	(2)(4) "Fantasy sports contest" means any fantasy or simulation sports game
25	or contest played through the internet or mobile device with all of the following
26	elements:
27	(a) Participants create a simulation sports team based on the current
28	membership of actual amateur or professional sports organizations.
29	(b) All prizes and awards offered to winning participants are established and
30	made known to the participants in advance of the game or contest, and the value of
31	the prizes or awards is not determined by the number of participants or the amount
32	of any fees paid by those participants.
33	(c) All winning outcomes reflect the relative knowledge and skill of the
34	participant and are predominantly determined by accumulated statistical results of
35	the performance of the individuals, including athletes in the case of sporting events.
36	(d) No winning outcome is based on either of the following:
37	(i) On the score, point-spread, or any performance or performances of any
38	single real-world team or any combination of such teams.
39	(ii) Solely on any single performance of an individual athlete in any single
40	real-world sporting or other event.
41	(5) "Fantasy sports contest operator" or "operator" means a person or entity
42	that is licensed by the board to offer a platform for the playing of fantasy sports
43	contests, to administer one or more fantasy sports contests with an entry fee, and to
44	award a prize of value.
45	(6) "Fantasy sports contest player" or "player" means a person who
46	participates in a fantasy sports contest offered by a fantasy sports contest operator.
47	(7) "Gross fantasy sports contest revenues" means the amount equal to the
48	total of all entry fees that a fantasy sports contest operator collects from all fantasy
49	sports contest players, multiplied by the location percentage for the state of
50	Louisiana.

1	(9) "I partian percentage" means for each fontagy sports contast the
1 2	(8) "Location percentage" means, for each fantasy sports contest, the percentage rounded to the nearest tenth of a percent of the total of entry fees
$\frac{2}{3}$	collected from fantasy sports contest players located in the state of Louisiana,
4	divided by the total entry fees collected from such players participating in fantasy
5	sports contests.
6	(9) "Net revenue" means for all fantasy sports contests, the amount equal to
7	the total entry fees collected from all participants entering such fantasy sports
8	contests, less the winnings paid to participants in the contests.

10	§304. Gaming Control Board; duties and powers
11	A. The board shall perform the duties and functions as authorized by the
12	provisions of this Chapter and the regulatory authority with respect to the regulation
13	of fantasy sports contests as provided by R.S. 27:15.
14	B. The board shall adopt, pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, all
15	rules necessary to implement, administer, and regulate fantasy sports contests as
16	authorized in this Chapter. The rules shall include but not be limited to the following:
17	(1) The issuance of any license, contract, or permit authorized by this Chapter,
18	subject to regulation of the board.
19	(2) The methods of and forms and procedures for making an application for
20	a license, contract, or permit to be considered by the board.
21	(3) The methods of and forms for providing to the board information
22	concerning a person's family, habits, character, associates, criminal record, business
23	activities, and financial affairs.
24	(4) Not later than August 1, 2020, the board shall institute rulemaking
25 26	procedures as necessary to implement the provisions of this Subsection.
26 27	<u>C. Upon direction of the board, the office of state police and the attorney</u>
27 28	general shall submit proposed rules to the board for consideration, modification, and promulgation as provided in this Section.
28	D. The board shall not adopt rules and regulations pertaining to campaign
30	finance and contributions which are more restrictive than the provisions of law found
31	generally in Chapter 11 of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, and
32	specifically in R.S. 18:1505.2(L).

34	§306. Licensing of fantasy sports contest operators
35	A. No fantasy sports contest operator shall offer any fantasy sports contest
36	in this state without first being licensed by the board. Applications for licensure
37	shall be on forms provided by the board. Each license shall be granted for a period
38	of three years.
39	B. Before obtaining a license to offer fantasy sports contests in this state, a
40	fantasy sports contest operator shall:
41	(1) Be a person domiciled in Louisiana or a domestic business entity with a
42	certificate of existence from the Secretary of State and in good standing or a foreign
43	corporation with a certificate of authority to transact business in this state from the
44	Secretary of State and in good standing.
45	(2) Demonstrate to the board that the operator is suitable for licensing
46 47	pursuant to R.S. 27:28.
47 48	C. Any fantasy sports contest operator that allows its license to lapse, without
48 49	requesting an extension of time to file for renewal of the license, shall be required to resubmit an initial application for licensure. An extension may be granted by the
49 50	board upon receipt of a written request prior to the lapse of the license.
51	D. A license issued by the board to a fantasy sports contest operator shall not
52	be transferable.
53	§307. Issuance or denial of license
54	A. The board shall consider all applications for licensure and shall issue a
55	valid license to an applicant that meets the criteria set forth in this Chapter.
56	B. The board shall deny a license to any applicant who does not meet the
57	criteria as set forth in this Chapter and as established by the board.
58	C. The board shall issue or deny an operator's license within sixty days of
59	receipt of an application for licensure. If a license is not issued, the board shall
60	provide the operator with specific reasons for not issuing a license.

1	D. A license issued by the board to a fantasy sports contest operator shall not
2	be transferable.
3	§308. License requirements
4	A. As a condition of licensure, a fantasy sports contest operator shall submit
5	evidence to the board that the operator has established and will implement
6	commercially reasonable procedures for fantasy sports contests with an entry fee
7	that:
8	(1) Prevent employees of the fantasy sports contest operator, and relatives of
9	an employee living in the same household as an employee of an operator, from
10	competing in fantasy sports contests offered by an operator in which the operator
11	offers a cash prize to the general public.
12 13	(2) Prevent sharing of confidential information that could affect fantasy sports contests with third parties until the information is made publicly available.
13 14	(3) Provide that no winning outcome is based on the score, point spread, or
14	any performance of any single actual real-world sports team or combination of such
15	teams or solely on any single performance of an individual athlete or participant in
10	any single actual real-world sporting event.
18	(4) Ensure that any of following persons do not participate in fantasy sports
19	contests:
20	(a) Athletes and individuals who participate in or officiate a game or
21	competition that is the subject of a fantasy sports contest.
22	(b) Any sports agent, team employee, referee, or league official associated
23	with a sport or athletic event.
24	(5) Verify that a fantasy sports contest player is twenty-one years of age or (5)
25	older.
26	(6) Provide fantasy sports contest players with access to information on
27 28	responsible play.
28 29	(7) Provide fantasy sports contest players with access to the fantasy sports contest player's play history and account details.
30	(8) Allow individuals to restrict themselves from entering a fantasy sports
31	contest upon request and provide reasonable steps to prevent the person entering
32	fantasy sports contests offered by an operator.
33	(9) Segregate fantasy sports contest player funds from operational funds or
34	maintain a reserve that exceeds the amount of player funds on deposit, which may
35	not be used for operational activities. Reserve funds may take the form of cash, cash
36	equivalents, payment process reserves, payment processor receivables, an
37	irrevocable letter of credit, a bond, or a combination thereof, in the amount that must
38	exceed the total balances of the fantasy sports contest players' accounts.
39	B. A fantasy sports contest operator shall not offer fantasy sports contests
40 41	based on the performances of participants in high school or youth athletic events.
41 42	<u>C. A fantasy sports contest operator shall not offer a fantasy sports contest</u> to the general public that does not establish and make known all prizes and awards
43	offered to winning participants in advance of the game or contest.
44	D. A licensed fantasy sports contest operator shall:
45	(1) Annually contract with a certified public accountant to conduct an
46	independent audit that is consistent with the standards accepted by the American
47	Institute of Certified Public Accountants.
48	(2) Submit to the board a copy of the audit report.
49	§309. Allowing underage persons to play fantasy sports contests; revocation hearing
50	A.(1) No person licensed pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, or any
51	agent or employee thereof, shall allow a person under the age of twenty-one years
52 52	to be a fantasy sports contest player.
53 54	(2) No person licensed pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, or any agent or employee thereof, shall allow a person to participate in a fantasy sports
54 55	contest in a parish in which, at the election held pursuant to R.S. 27:303, a majority
55 56	of the qualified electors in the parish voting on the proposition to authorize fantasy
57	sports contests in the parish voted against the proposition.
58	B.(1) The person licensed pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter shall
59	withhold all winnings from fantasy sports contest players who are determined to be
60	under the age of twenty-one years and from fantasy sports contest players
61	participating in a fantasy sports contest in a parish in which, at the election held

1	pursuant to R.S. 27:303, a majority of the qualified electors in the parish voting on
2	the proposition to authorize fantasy sports contests in the parish voted against the
3	proposition.
4	(2) The person licensed pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter shall each
5	quarter report and remit to the division all winnings withheld from fantasy sports
6	contest players pursuant to the provisions of this Section.
7	§310. Reporting of gaming proceeds
8	An operator shall periodically report the following information to the
9	division, which is not confidential and shall be available for public inspection:
10	(1) The operator's gross fantasy sports contest revenues.
11	(2) The operator's net revenue.
12	(3) Quarterly and annual financial statements regarding their operations in
13	Louisiana submitted to the division that present historical data, including annual
14	financial statements that have been audited by an independent certified public
15	accountant as required by R.S. 27:308(D).
16	§311. Investigations and violations
17	A. The division shall conduct such investigations, hearings, and inquiries as
18	it deems necessary to fulfill its responsibilities under the provisions of this Chapter.
19	A license may be suspended prior to a hearing upon a written finding of danger to
20	public health and welfare.
21	B. As a condition of receiving a license under the provisions of this Chapter,
22	each operator agrees that the division and its agents and employees shall have
23	unrestricted access and the right to inspect any premises or electronic platform under
24	the control of the operator in which any activity relating to the provisions of this
25	Chapter is conducted.
26	§312. Limitation on active accounts; obligations to participants
27	An operator shall:
28	(1) Limit each authorized player to one active and continuously used account.
29	(2) Publish and facilitate parental control procedures to allow parents or
30	guardians to exclude minors from access to any contest or platform. The procedures
31	shall include a toll-free number to call for help in establishing such parental controls.
32	(3) Make clear conspicuous statements that are not inaccurate or misleading
33	concerning the chances of winning and the number of winners when referencing the
34	chances or likelihood of winning.
35	(4) Permit any authorized player to permanently close an account registered
36	to the player, on any and all platforms supported by the operator or registrant, at any
37	time and for any reason.
38	(5) Identify all highly experienced players in any contest by a symbol
39	attached to the players' username, or by other visible means, on all platforms
40	supported by the operator or registrant.
41	(6) Implement measures to protect the privacy and online security of
42	authorized players, their account, and their personal financial information.
43	§313. Charging for inactive accounts
44	A. An operator shall not charge players for inactive accounts.
45	B. An operator shall charge players only for entry fees placed or contests
46	entered. No player shall be charged for failure to enter on a fantasy sports contest
47	or for failure to deposit certain amounts of cash or cash equivalent into any account.
48	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor
49	or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law
50	without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the
51	Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by
52	the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval."
