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Provides relative to the photo identification issued to an offender prior to his release. (8/1/20)

<u>Proposed law</u> amends and reenacts specific parts of the law pertaining to photo identification for people released from incarceration to now include a list of all licensing and certification programs completed while incarcerated.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that to the extent that funding is available, the Department of Public Safety and Corrections - Corrections Services will issue a card to the offender that includes a list of all vocational licensing and certification programs completed by the offender while incarcerated.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

<u>Proposed law</u> will result in an increase in SGF expenditures to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections - Corrections Services (DPSC - CS) to implement to the extent cards are issued. DPSC - CS currently provides offenders with an official Office of Motor Vehicle (OMV) state ID upon release. The official OMV state ID cannot be altered; therefore, if this legislation passes, DPSC - CS will provide a secondary form of "non-official" ID. The secondary form of ID would cost around \$5 per person.

There are approximately 16,000 people released from DPSC - CS custody annually. It would cost the state an additional \$80,000 per year to provide a secondary form of ID to every person released containing the information required in the proposed law. However, the department has indicated that approximately 3,000 people released each year have achieved a license or certification that would be impacted by proposed law. Given an assumption of 3,000 ID cards to be issued annually, the cost would fall to \$15,000 per year. DPSC - CS currently issues a certificate of completed courses in the release packet. Proposed law provides that such a card will be issued to the extent that funding is available.

## **REVENUE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
