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| 2 | To amend and reenact R.S. 29:735(A)(1), and to enact R.S. 29:773, relative to immunity |
| 3 | from civil liability; to provide relative to certain immunity by public entities and |
| 4 | persons from civil liability during disasters and emergencies; to provide relative to |
| 5 | the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act; to |
| 6 | provide relative to limitation of liability during the COVID-19 public health |
| 7 | emergency; to provide certain terms and conditions; and to provide for related |

| 9 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 10 | Section 1. R.S. 29:735(A)(1) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 29:773 is |
| 11 | hereby enacted to read as follows: |
| 12 | §735. Immunity of personnel |
| 13 | A.(1) Neither the state nor any political subdivision thereof, nor other state |
| 14 | agencies, nor, except in case of willful misconduct, the agents' employees or |
| 15 | representatives of any of them engaged in any homeland security and emergency |
| 16 | preparedness and recovery activities, while complying with or attempting to comply |

| 1 | with this Chapter or any rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provisions |
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| 2 | of this Chapter shall be liable for the death of or any injury to persons or damage to |
| 3 | property as a result of such activity. |

| 5 | §773. Limitation of liability during the COVID-19 public health emergency |
| 6 | A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no |
| 7 | natural or juridical person, state or local government, or political subdivision |
| 8 | thereof, shall be liable for damages or personal injury resulting from or related |
| 9 | to an actual or alleged exposure to COVID-19 in the course of or through the |
| 10 | performance or provision of the person's, government's, or political |
| 11 | subdivision's business operations unless the person, government, or political |
| 12 | subdivision failed to substantially comply with the applicable COVID-19 |
| 13 | procedures established by the federal, state, or local agency which governs the |
| 14 | business operations and the injury or death was caused by the person's, |
| 15 | government's, or political subdivision's gross negligence or wanton or reckless |
| 16 | misconduct. If two or more sources of procedures are applicable to the business |
| 17 | operations at the time of the actual or alleged exposure, the person, government, |
| 18 | or political subdivision shall substantially comply with any one applicable set |
| 19 | of procedures. |
| 20 | B. This Section shall not apply if the damages that resulted from or are |
| 21 | related to the actual or alleged exposure to COVID-19 are shown by the |
| 22 | evidence to be the result of gross negligence, willful misconduct, or intentional |
| 23 | criminal misconduct. |
| 24 | <u>C. This Section shall not affect the right of any person to receive benefits</u> |
| 25 | to which he would otherwise be entitled under the Louisiana Workers' |
| 26 | Compensation Law. |
| 27 | Section 2. Due to the imminent threat posed by COVID-19 as provided in |
| 28 | Proclamation Number 25 JBE 2020 and any subsequent proclamation, declaring the |
| 29 | existence of a statewide public health emergency, Section 1 of this Act shall be retroactive |
| 30 | to March 11, 2020. |

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| 1 | Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not |
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| 2 | signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature |
| 3 | by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If |
| 4 | vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become |
| 5 | effective on the day following such approval. |
