EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

LDH indicates that it is currently contracting with private labs to perform COVID-19 testing. The department is using its existing budget to pay for the cost of the contracts.

CARES Act funding is allocated to LDH in the FY 20 supplemental appropriation bill (HB 307) and FY 21 general appropriation bill (HB 105). Once the appropriation bills are enacted, the department plans to use CARES Act funds to continue these contracts.

NOTE: The LFO is not able to determine if the contracts with private labs meet the definition of "supporting private sector healthcare systems" as provided in the resolution.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
