CONDOLENCES. Expresses condolences on the death of Marvin Charles Gros Sr.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To express the sincere condolences of the Legislature of Louisiana upon the death of Marvin
3	Charles Gros Sr.
4	WHEREAS, it is with great sadness that Louisiana citizens learned of the death of
5	Marvin Gros Sr. on May 30, 2020, at the age of seventy-one; and
6	WHEREAS, Marvin Gros Sr. was born on December 10, 1948, in Donaldsonville,
7	Louisiana, to Ridley Gros Sr. and Ezal Daigle Gros; and
8	WHEREAS, after he graduated from Ascension Catholic High School in 1966, as
9	Salutatorian, and from Nicholls State University in 1970, he started a successful insurance
10	agency; and
11	WHEREAS, after retiring from the family's insurance business, he obtained a
12	Doctorate of Law from Southern University Law Center in 1990 where he graduated second
13	in his class of 167 students, and upon graduating he opened his law practice which
14	specialized in personal injury, bankruptcy, social security, and corporate law; and
15	WHEREAS, Marvin Gros Sr. became licensed to practice in all parishes of
16	Louisiana, the Eastern, Middle, and Western Districts of the United States as well as the 1st
17	and 5th Circuit Court of Appeals and on June 5, 2017, he received an admission to the
18	Supreme Court of the United States; and

1	WHEREAS, he joined many organizations which would allow him to serve his
2	community such as the Best Attorneys of America, the 23rd Judicial Bar Association,
3	appointed by Governor Foster to the Capital Area Human Services District in 1999,
4	appointed as a member of the Louisiana Bar Foundation and a Cornerstone Member, and
5	became a member of the Baton Rouge Bar Association and the American Bar Association;

7	WHEREAS, Marvin Gros Sr.'s belief in giving back to his community was often
8	acknowledged in various awards he received such as being honored as the National District
9	Justice of Phi Alpha Delta Law Fraternity during his senior year in law school, being elected
10	President of the Donaldsonville Chapter of the Jaycees and at the age of twenty-four he was
11	elected President of the Louisiana Jaycees becoming the youngest state president in the
12	nation, and he was named one of Louisiana's Outstanding Young Men in 1976; and
13	WHEREAS, he was named the Donaldsonville Area Chamber of Commerce Citizen
14	of the Year in 2017 and received the Commander's Award from the United States Marine
15	Corps; and
16	WHEREAS, Marvin Gros Sr. was actively involved in fundraisers for his church,
17	Ascension Catholic, raising over \$100,000 to contribute to the programs of the church and
18	its school; and
19	WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife, Myra Nichols Gros; a daughter, Casey Gros
20	Hood; two sons, Marvin C. Gros Jr. (Jill), and Aaron J. Gros (Dana); and eight
21	grandchildren, Alyssa Gros, Alex Gros, Sage Reine, Brennan Gros, Landon Gros, Cade
22	Hernandez, Cadence Hood, and Blake Hood Jr.; and
23	WHEREAS, he was preceded in death by his parents, brother Ridley Gros Jr., and
24	stepson, Chad Nichols; and
25	WHEREAS, the communities of Ascension Parish and the City of Donaldsonville,
26	decided to celebrated his 70th birthday, by proclaiming December 10, 2018, as "Marvin Gros
27	Sr. Day" in honor and appreciation of him and his service to them; and
28	WHEREAS, Louisiana has lost one of its' finest gentlemen with the passing of
29	Marvin Charles Gros Sr.
