SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 12

COURTS. Creates the Drug and Specialty Courts Commission.

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A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To create the Drug and Specialty Courts Commission to study and evaluate the utilization of opioid settlement funds for the expansion and optimization of drug and specialty courts in Louisiana.

WHEREAS, the state of Louisiana and its citizens have been, and continue to be, plagued by an epidemic related to the overuse and abuse of opioids, causing countless deaths, health issues, addiction to opioids and other substances, as well as increased criminal activity related thereto; and

WHEREAS, the state of Louisiana is currently involved in litigation and negotiations with numerous manufacturers and distributors of opioid products as a result of the damage and injury to the state of Louisiana and its citizens caused by these opioid products; and

WHEREAS, the state of Louisiana expects to receive substantial funds from the settlement of opioid litigation to mitigate the damage and injury to the citizens of Louisiana and to protect and improve the health and safety of the citizens of Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, the state of Louisiana has, and continues to utilize, drug and specialty courts throughout the state to provide early intervention, counseling, and treatment for citizens with substance abuse disorders which have contributed to the commission of certain crimes; and

1 WHEREAS, the early intervention and treatment modalities utilized by Louisiana
2 drug and specialty courts have shown great success with providing treatment for substance
3 abuse disorders, improving outcomes for participants, and reducing recidivism among
4 participants; and

5 WHEREAS, the strong correlation between substance abuse disorders and criminal
6 activity require any settlement funds be targeted to address these issues.

7 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
8 create the Drug and Specialty Courts Commission to study and evaluate the utilization of
9 opioid settlement funds for the expansion and optimization of drug and specialty courts in
10 Louisiana and to recommend any legislative changes necessary to provide for early
11 intervention and treatment of citizens of Louisiana with substance abuse disorders who
12 become involved in the criminal justice system in Louisiana as a result of such substance
13 abuse disorders.

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the commission shall be composed of the
15 following members:

16 (1) The speaker of the Louisiana House of Representatives, or his designee.

17 (2) The president of the Louisiana Senate, or his designee.

18 (3) The attorney general, or his designee, who shall serve as chair, and one additional
19 member appointed by the attorney general from his staff.

20 (4) The chief justice of the Louisiana Supreme Court, or her designee.

21 (5) The executive director of the Louisiana District Attorneys Association, or his
22 designee.

23 (6) The president of the Louisiana Sheriffs' Association, or his designee.

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a majority of the membership of the commission
25 shall constitute a quorum. The commission shall meet at the call of the chair or upon an
26 affirmative vote of a majority of the members. All members shall be notified in writing of
27 all meetings at least five days before the date on which a meeting of the commission is
28 scheduled.

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that meetings of the commission shall take place at
30 the Louisiana State Capitol, or upon a vote of the majority of the commission members, such

1 meetings may be conducted by video conference when circumstances necessitate the conduct
2 of such meetings in that manner. The first meeting of the commission shall take place no
3 later than August 1, 2020. The Department of Justice shall provide staff support for the
4 commission.

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duties of the commission shall include but
6 not be limited to all of the following:

7 (1) Evaluate the data received by the Louisiana Supreme Court Drug and Specialty
8 Court Office with regards to the operation and results of the drug and specialty courts in
9 Louisiana.

10 (2) Evaluate and develop a plan for increasing the number of individuals screened
11 for eligibility and suitability for drug and specialty court programs in Louisiana.

12 (3) Analyze the resources necessary for, and costs associated with, increased
13 screening and increased utilization of drug and specialty court programs as well as the
14 sources requiring those resources.

15 (4) Recommend the amount of funds necessary and the recipients of those necessary
16 funds for the increased screening and utilization of drug and specialty court programs in
17 Louisiana.

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the commission may request and collect relevant
19 and necessary data and information to accomplish its purposes from state and local
20 government agencies, including courts.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the entities and court systems from which such
22 information and data is requested may, to the extent feasible, provide such information and
23 data to the commission at no cost.

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the commission shall prepare and submit a
25 report of its findings and policies and legislative recommendations to the speaker of the
26 House of Representatives and the president of the Senate no later than February 1, 2021, and
27 any further reports or recommendations thereafter as requested by the legislature or as
28 advised by the commission.

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the commission shall cease to exist upon an
30 affirmative vote of the members, but no later than June 1, 2021.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to each
2 of the commission members and the appointing entities provided in this Resolution.
