BESE. Requests BESE to adopt adjustments to the MFP formula to ensure that school districts impacted by Hurricane Laura do not lose funding during the 2020-2021 fiscal year due to decreases in student enrollment.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge and request the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to adopt adjustments to the minimum foundation program (MFP) formula to ensure that school districts impacted by Hurricane Laura do not lose MFP funding during the 2020-2021 fiscal year due to decreases in student enrollment. WHEREAS, the Constitution of Louisiana requires that the legislature provide for the education of the people of the state and further requires that the legislature establish and maintain a public educational system; and WHEREAS, the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education has the constitutional responsibility of annually developing, adopting, and submitting to the legislature for its approval and funding a formula to be used to determine the cost of a minimum foundation program of education in all public elementary and secondary schools as well as to equitably allocate the funds to local school systems; and WHEREAS, the legislature may not amend the formula that is adopted by the board and submitted to the legislature for its consideration but may only return an unsatisfactory formula to the board, along with recommendations to the board for an amended formula; and WHEREAS, on August 26, 2020, Hurricane Laura, the strongest hurricane on record

to hit Louisiana, slammed ashore and caused immense damage from the southern coast to

the	northern	border	of th	e state:	and

WHEREAS, the storm wreaked havoc in the areas it crossed, downing power lines, destroying basic infrastructure, and leaving the homes of many uninhabitable; and

WHEREAS, the destruction has caused many citizens to relocate until their homes can be rebuilt; and

WHEREAS, the facilities of many schools were severely damaged or destroyed, thus interrupting educational services; and

WHEREAS, the MFP formula calculates payments to schools based on their student enrollment; and

WHEREAS, the displacement of students from the storm will likely negatively impact many of the school districts affected by Hurricane Laura and, at a minimum, these parishes should be held harmless for the loss of students during the 2020-2021 fiscal year and receive their full MFP allocation.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to adopt adjustments to the minimum foundation program (MFP) formula to ensure that school districts impacted by Hurricane Laura do not lose MFP funding during the 2020-2021 fiscal year due to decreases in student enrollment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the adjustments to the MFP formula, at a minimum, hold the impacted districts in Acadia, Allen, Beauregard, Caddo, Calcasieu, Cameron, Grant, Jackson, Jefferson Davis, LaSalle, Lincoln, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Rapides, Sabine, St. Landry, Union, Vermilion, Vernon, and Winn parishes harmless for the loss of students due to Hurricane Laura.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the adjustments to the MFP formula adopted by BESE be submitted to the legislature by October 15, 2020.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education and the state superintendent of education.
