Amendments proposed by House Committee on Appropriations to Original House Bill No. 38 by Representative Harris

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 1, line 5, after "requirements;" and before "to provide" insert "to provide for  
3 training requirements;"

4 AMENDMENT NO. 2

5 On page 2, between lines 10 and 11, insert the following:

6 "D. When the postsecondary education institution submits its annual  
7 operating budget pursuant to Subsection A of this Section, each institution shall also  
8 submit certification that its college or university police department has completed the  
9 following annual training requirements:

10 (1) Peer intervention training.

11 (2) Racial bias training.

12 (3) Training and instruction to comply with accreditation standards in the  
13 following areas:

14 (a) The use of deadly force, less lethal force, and de-escalation tactics and  
15 techniques.

16 (b) Investigation of officer misconduct and practices and procedures for  
17 referring to prosecuting authorities allegations of officer use of excessive force or  
18 racial profiling.

19 (c) Disproportionate contact by law enforcement with minority communities.

20 (d) Tactical and defensive strategy.

21 (e) Arrests, searches, and restraint.

22 (f) Professional verbal communications with civilians.

23 (g) Proper traffic, pedestrian, and other enforcement stops.

24 (h) Community relations and bias awareness.

25 (i) Interactions with the following groups:

26 (i) Youth.

27 (ii) Individuals with disabilities.

28 (iii) Individuals with limited English proficiency.

29 (iv) Multi-cultural communities.

30 E. If any postsecondary education institution fails to submit the certification  
31 required in Subsection D of this Section, the institution shall be ineligible to apply  
32 for or receive funding for new capital outlay projects for the ensuing fiscal year."

33 AMENDMENT NO. 3

34 On page 3, after line 4, add the following:

35 "D. Each governing authority identified in Subsection A of this Section shall  
36 submit certification at least fifteen days prior to the beginning of the governing  
37 authority's ensuing fiscal year that its municipal police department or sheriff's office  
38 has completed the following annual training requirements:

39 (1) Peer intervention training.

40 (2) Racial bias training.

41 (3) Training and instruction to comply with accreditation standards in the  
42 following areas:

43 (a) The use of deadly force, less lethal force, and de-escalation tactics and  
44 techniques.

18 sales tax dedications for the ensuing fiscal year."
