SENATE BILL NO. 61

BY SENATORS MIZELL AND JOHNS

GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATION. Creates the office of broadband and connectivity.  
(gov sig) (Item #39)

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AN ACT

To enact R.S. 36:4(CC), R.S. 49:968(B)(21)(d), and Chapter 12 of Title 51 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 51:1361 through 1364, relative to the office of broadband and connectivity; to place the office within the executive branch; to provide definitions; to provide for the appointment and termination of an executive director; to require reporting; to provide for functions, powers, and duties; to establish contract authority; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 36:4(CC) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§4. Structure of executive branch of state government

\* \* \*

**CC. The office of broadband and connectivity (R.S. 51:1361 et seq.) shall be placed within the office of the governor and shall perform and exercise its powers, duties, functions, and responsibilities as provided by law.**

Section 2. R.S. 49:968(B)(21)(d) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§968. Review of agency rules; fees

3                   (d) The office of broadband and connectivity shall submit the report to  
4                   the House Committee on Commerce and the Senate Committee on Commerce,  
5                   Consumer Protection and International Affairs.

7                   Section 3. Chapter 12 of Title 51 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950,  
8                   comprised of R.S. 51:1361 through 1364, is hereby enacted to read as follows:

9                   CHAPTER 12. THE OFFICE OF BROADBAND AND CONNECTIVITY

10                   §1361. Definitions

11                   When used in this Chapter:

12                   (1) "Connectivity" means the capacity for the interconnection of  
13                   platforms, systems, and applications. It includes but is not limited to systems  
14                   that utilize cable, fiber, lines, satellites, sound waves, or wire to transmit  
15                   information.

16                   (2) "Government agency" means any department, office, council, or  
17                   agency of the federal, state, or local government, or any public benefit  
18                   corporation or authority authorized by law.

19                   (3) "Office" means the office of broadband and connectivity.

20                   (4) "Person" means any natural or juridical person, including  
21                   corporations.

22                   §1362. Office of broadband and connectivity; creation

23                   A. There is hereby created within the office of the governor the office of  
24                   broadband and connectivity. The head of the office shall be the executive  
25                   director of broadband and connectivity and shall be appointed by the governor  
26                   from a list of three candidates nominated by the Joint Legislative Committee on  
27                   Technology and Cybersecurity. Any vacancy occurring for this appointment  
28                   shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. The governor  
29                   may terminate the executive director but only with the concurrence of the

1 nominating committee, except in the case of gross negligence or willful  
2 misconduct by the executive director.

3 B. The executive director shall employ necessary staff to carry out the  
4 duties and functions of the office as provided in this Chapter and as otherwise  
5 provided by law.

6 C. On or before February first of each year, the executive director shall  
7 prepare and submit to the governor, the House Committee on Commerce, the  
8 Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection and International  
9 Affairs, and the Joint Legislative Committee on Technology and Cybersecurity,  
10 a comprehensive report to include, at a minimum, the following information:

11 (1) Activities undertaken by the office during the previous year.

12 (2) Data concerning broadband and other connectivity services in the  
13 state and expansion and deployment of these services.

14 (3) An assessment of the current availability and accessibility of  
15 broadband and other connectivity services in the state.

16 (4) A mapping initiative to identify availability of broadband to every  
17 home and business in the state.

18 (5) Availability and description of public or private grants available for  
19 the expansion or enhancement of broadband services and other connectivity  
20 services in the state.

21 (6) Recommendations for legislative proposals.

22 (7) Identification of resources to assist the office in performing its  
23 functions and duties.

24 D. The governor shall direct that all state agencies provide the executive  
25 director with assistance in advancing the purpose of the office and assure that  
26 the activities of the office are fully coordinated with the activities of state  
27 agencies providing related services.

28 §1363. Functions, powers, and duties

29 The office of broadband and connectivity, by and through the executive

1 director or his employees, shall have the following functions, powers, and  
2 duties:

3 (1) To provide comprehensive information relating to broadband and  
4 connectivity in the state upon request to any person or government agency.

5 (2) To advise and assist any person or government agency in addressing  
6 particular broadband and connectivity needs, including cooperative efforts  
7 among these persons and agencies.

8 (3) To develop a mapping initiative to provide a local-level methodology  
9 that precisely maps the availability of broadband services to every home and  
10 business in the state.

11 (4) To research programs relating to broadband and connectivity  
12 services and receive notification from every person and government agency  
13 engaged in the provision of broadband and connectivity services of program  
14 descriptions, appropriation data, and application procedures. The office shall  
15 maintain a listing of existing programs and advise any person or government  
16 agency of their existence.

17 (5) To assist, upon request, a person or government agency that has  
18 applied to a state or federal program in obtaining timely and efficient responses  
19 from state and federal agencies; to assist an applicant considering program  
20 grant strategies; to assist any state and federal agency in cooperative  
21 approaches to address the needs of the applicants; and to provide technical  
22 assistance to a government agency in formulating and implementing broadband  
23 expansion and connectivity programs.

24 (6) To encourage the assistance of the private sector, including  
25 broadband service providers, to effectuate the deployment and access to  
26 broadband and other connectivity services to all residents of the state.

27 (7) To assist the governor and the legislature in the development and  
28 integration of a broadband deployment plan and long-range plans to more  
29 effectively and efficiently provide access to any new connectivity options.

1                   **(8) To analyze and make recommendations concerning proposed state**  
2                   **legislation or programs that may affect the expansion of broadband and other**  
3                   **connectivity services.**

4                   **(9) To apply for, receive, and administer grants or financial assistance**  
5                   **from any person or government agency.**

6                   **(10) To adopt and promulgate rules and regulations, procedures,**  
7                   **instructions, and any forms considered necessary to implement the functions,**  
8                   **powers, and duties imposed upon the office by this Chapter in accordance with**  
9                   **the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act.**

10                  **(11) To do all things necessary or convenient to carry out the functions,**  
11                  **powers, and duties as provided in this Chapter.**

12                  **§1364. Contract authority**

13                  **The office may execute any agreement or contract with any person or**  
14                  **government agency necessary or convenient to carry out the provisions of this**  
15                  **Chapter.**

16                  Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not  
17                  signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature  
18                  by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If  
19                  vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become  
20                  effective on the day following such approval.

Proposed law creates the office of broadband and connectivity (office) within the office of the governor.

Proposed law provides for the governor's appointment of an executive director to head the office. The appointment shall be made from a list of three candidates nominated by the Joint Legislative Committee on Technology and Cybersecurity (joint committee).

Proposed law provides that any vacancy in the office shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.

Proposed law provides that except for gross negligence or willful misconduct, the governor

may terminate the executive director but only with concurrence of the joint committee.

Proposed law requires the executive director to employ necessary staff to carry out the duties and functions of the office.

Proposed law requires the executive director to submit an annual report to the legislature containing, at a minimum, information relating to the activities of the office, data concerning broadband or other connectivity services in the state, current availability and accessibility of broadband and other connectivity services, a mapping initiative, availability of grants for the expansion of broadband and connectivity services, proposed legislation, and resources to assist the office.

Proposed law requires the governor to direct all state agencies to assist the office in advancing the purpose of the office and to assure that the activities of the office are fully coordinated with the activities of state agencies providing related services.

Proposed law provides for the powers, duties, and functions of the office and the ability of the office to enter into any contract to carry about the provisions of proposed law.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
