COMMERCIAL REGULATIONS: Provides for a program of public health and safety options for businesses to implement during a public health emergency (Item #28)

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 29:770.1, relative to the provision of information during a public health
3	emergency; to mandate that the state fire marshal provide a mechanism for business
4	owners and operators to post mitigation measures to the public; to describe the
5	parameters and requirements of the mechanism; to exempt participants from liability;
6	to provide for emergency orders; to provide for rulemaking; and to provide for
7	related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 29:770.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§770.1. Informed patronage
11	A. The state fire marshal shall, in consultation with the Louisiana
12	Department of Health, make available a printable menu-styled form, that business
13	owners and operators shall post during a public health emergency, to inform the
14	public of the mitigation measures being taken inside of the establishment. The form
15	shall be available on the website maintained by the office of state fire marshal.
16	B. The state fire marshal shall ensure the form allows for the following
17	information to be conspicuously displayed:
18	(1) A menu of options, each represented by an easily identifiable image, of
19	the recommended mitigation measures that may be implemented by a business in

1	response to the public health emergency. The options are to include, but not be
2	limited to the following:
3	(a) Employees are required to wear masks.
4	(b) Customers are required to wear masks.
5	(c) Employees are periodically required to wash hands.
6	(d) Hand sanitizer is available.
7	(e) Social distancing is observed.
8	(f) Reduced occupancy limits are observed.
9	(g) No mitigation measures are being implemented.
10	(2) A reasonable and easily identifiable symbol for a business to indicate
11	which of the available menu options the business is implementing.
12	(3) The specific time and date when the business will adopt the indicated
13	safety procedures.
14	C. The state fire marshal shall provide rules relative to the size and
15	placement of the form, and the owner or operator shall post the form accordingly.
16	D. An owner or operator:
17	(1) May change the selected options at any time and shall modify the form
18	accordingly.
19	(2) May choose to remove the posting at any time.
20	(3) Shall not incur any civil liability as a result of posting the form, except
21	as provided in Subsection F of this Section.
22	E. During a public health emergency, an owner or operator shall have the
23	authority to choose which recommended mitigation measures will be implemented
24	inside of his establishment. Notwithstanding any emergency order to the contrary,
25	an owner or operator is only required to implement the mitigation measures he has
26	chosen, from the recommended options, and has indicated on the posted form.
27	F. The state fire marshal shall adopt such rules as are necessary to implement
28	the provisions of this Section.

- 1 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
- 2 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
- 3 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
- 4 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
- 5 effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Requires the state fire marshal to provide a form that businesses shall use to describe the mitigation measures they are implementing during a public health emergency.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the state fire marshal, in consultation with the Louisiana Department of Health, to provide a menu-styled form, which a business owner or operator shall print and post, in order to communicate to the public the mitigation measures being implemented during a declared public health emergency. Requires the form to be available on the state fire marshal website.

<u>Proposed law</u> describes the information the form is to contain.

<u>Proposed law</u> allows the operator to modify or remove the posted form at any time.

<u>Proposed law</u> shields an owner or operator from incurring liability as a result of the posted form.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the fire marshal to make rules specific to the size and placement of the sign and for owners or operators to follow those rules.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that only an operator has the authority to choose which precautions will be implemented and that those choices, once posted, take precedent over an emergency order.

<u>Proposed law</u> instructs the state fire marshal to promulgate rules necessary to implement proposed law.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Require owners or operators of businesses to utilize the form.
- 2. Add to the list of recommended measures that may be implemented.
- 3. Require the state fire marshal to provide rules relative to the sizing and hanging of the posted form.
- 4. Provide that the posted form, with mitigated measures indicated, is to serve as the standard for that (business), and is to take precedent over an emergency order in conflict with it.
- 5. Make <u>proposed law</u> effective upon the governor's signature.
- 6. Make technical changes.
