SCHOOLS: Authorizes administration of medical marijuana to a student by a parent, guardian, or authorized school employee at a public school (Item #42)

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 17:436.1(N), relative to the administration of medication in schools; to
3	provide for the administration of medical marijuana to students with a
4	recommendation from a licensed physician; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 17:436.1(N) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	§436.1. Administration of medication; definition; conditions; restrictions;
8	exceptions
9	* * *
0	N.(1) The governing authority of each public elementary and secondary
1	school may adopt a policy authorizing the administration of medical marijuana, in
12	forms permissible as defined in R.S. 40:1046, to students who have a
13	recommendation or referral from a licensed physician for its use. Such a policy shall
14	provide that a primary caregiver of the student may possess and administer medical
15	marijuana to the student in addition to or in lieu of a school nurse or other authorized
16	school personnel.
17	(2) A policy adopted pursuant to this Subsection is subject to the following:
18	(a) The school principal, primary caregiver, and school nurse or other
19	authorized school personnel administering the medical marijuana shall enter into a
20	contract for such administration.

2	school property every school day that it will be administered.
3	(c) The medical marijuana shall be stored in a locked box on school

7	(3) The governing authority of any public elementary or secondary school
8	that does not adopt a policy authorizing the administration of medical marijuana
9	pursuant to this Subsection shall post on its website a statement that it does not have

11	(4) Any school personnel authorized to administer medical marijuana
12	pursuant to this Subsection shall be exempt from the provisions of R.S. 40:966. This
13	Paragraph shall not prevent the arrest or prosecution of any person for diversion of
14	marijuana or any of its derivatives or other conduct outside the scope of the state-
15	sponsored medical marijuana program.
16	(5) Subsections B through I of this Section are applicable to the
17	administration of medical marijuana.

**Abstract:** Provides relative to the administration of medical marijuana in public schools.

<u>Present law</u> provides for requirements and restrictions relative to the administration of medication to public school students and defines "medication" to mean all prescription and nonprescription drugs. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and makes it applicable to medical marijuana.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the governing authority of each public elementary and secondary school to adopt a policy authorizing a primary caregiver, school nurse, or other authorized school personnel to administer medical marijuana, in a form permissible under <u>present law</u>, to a student with a recommendation or referral from a licensed physician.

If such policy is adopted, the policy shall require the following:

- (1) School administration and the person administering the medication shall enter into a contract.
- (2) The student's primary caregiver shall bring the medication on and off school property each day.
- (3) The medication shall be stored in a locked box on school property.

A school employee administering the medication is subject to written parental consent under present law. Proposed law exempts such employee from prosecution under present law.
