PUBLIC HEALTH/OFFICE EG NO IMPACT See Note Page 1 of 1  
Requires regular reporting of the number of school-age children known to have an infectious disease during a public health emergency relating to the disease (Item #28)

Proposed law requires that during any public health emergency declared in accordance with present law and related to one or more infectious diseases, the office of public health shall transmit all of the following recipients, on a weekly basis, a report which provides the total number of school-age children in this state known to have been infected with each disease addressed by the public health emergency declaration: 1) the state superintendent of education; 2) each elected member of the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education; and 3) each elected member of the Louisiana Legislature.

Proposed law defines school aged children as all children who are at least 4 years of age and have not attained the age of 18.
