BY SENATOR CARTER

PUBLIC RECORDS. To provide relative to the disclosure of certain personal information of appointed and certain elected officials. (gov sig) (Item #46)

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 44:3.6, relative to disclosure of personal information by state and local
3 government agencies; to prohibit the disclosure of the home address and telephone
4 number of appointed or elected judges or law enforcement officials; to provide for
5 an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 44:3.6 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

8 **§3.6. Judges and law enforcement officials; confidentiality of certain personal**
9 **information**

10 **No state or local government agency shall knowingly post or publish in**
11 **any manner the home address or telephone number of any elected or appointed**
12 **judge or law enforcement official without the written permission of that**
13 **individual.**

14 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
15 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
16 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
17 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become

1 effective on the day following such approval.
