SCHOOLS: Requests the state Department of Education and Louisiana Department of Health to identify resources necessary to install water bottle filling stations in schools

A RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the state Department of Education and the Louisiana Department of
3	Health to identify solutions and resources necessary to install water bottle filling
4	stations during new construction and renovation projects at public elementary and
5	secondary schools.
6	WHEREAS, adequate water consumption has a positive impact on students'
7	cognitive performance, particularly short-term memory; drinking water can also improve
8	visual attention and fine motor skills; and
9	WHEREAS, proper hydration plays an important role in maintaining a child's overall
10	health by supporting muscles, joints, tissue, and the digestive system; and
11	WHEREAS, a study conducted by the National Sanitation Foundation International
12	found there were more germs found on an average classroom water fountain spigot than
13	there were on a toilet seat; amidst a global pandemic, personal water bottles and water bottle
14	filling stations may help reduce the spread of germs and disease, while also promoting water
15	consumption among Louisiana youth; and
16	WHEREAS, access to clean drinking water in schools varies based on many factors;
17	all students, regardless of grade level, socioeconomic status, or geographic area deserve to
18	attend a school that provides such a resource at no cost; and
19	WHEREAS, water bottle filling stations would provide a safe alternative to a water
20	fountain, allow for social distancing, and increase access to water for public school students,
21	teachers, and staff; and

1 WHEREAS, the cost of installing a station is comparable, if not less expensive, than 2 the cost of installing a water fountain; and 3 WHEREAS, the Lafayette Parish school system recently took the initiative to install 4 water bottle filling stations in all schools scheduled to undergo renovations or construction; 5 other school systems throughout Louisiana are currently considering similar moves. 6 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the state Department of Education and 7 8 the Louisiana Department of Health to identify solutions and resources necessary to install 9 water bottle filling stations during new construction and renovation projects at public 10 elementary and secondary schools. 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state Department of Education and the 12 Louisiana Department of Health shall conduct an analysis of the cost of installing water 13 bottle filling stations versus traditional water fountains, including but not limited to the cost 14 of new construction and retrofitting existing water fountains into water bottle filling stations 15 and include such analysis in a report to be submitted to the House Committee on Education 16 and House Committee on Health and Welfare no later than 60 days prior to the 2021 Regular 17 Session. 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted 19 to the state superintendent of education and the secretary of the Louisiana Department of 20 Health.
