CONDOLENCES: Expresses condolences on the death of Kwame I. Asante

A RESOLUTION
To express the condolences of the House of Representatives upon the death of Kwame I.
Asante.
WHEREAS, Kwame I. Asante was born in San Diego, California, on December 24,
1970, as James Elmer Franklin, III, to the union of James Elmer Franklin, Jr., and Lillian
Franklin; he accepted Christ at an early age and attended St. Stephens Church of God in
Christ while residing in San Diego; and
WHEREAS, Kwame was a member of the 1989 graduating class at Helix High
School in La Mesa, California; he was an avid scholar and athlete and served as the president
of his school's speech club; he received numerous awards at speech debates and achieved
the distinction of Eagle Scout; and
WHEREAS, upon graduating from high school, Kwame received a scholarship to
attend Southern University in Baton Rouge; at Southern, he played football and earned a
bachelor's degree in education; and
WHEREAS, Kwame embraced the culture of Louisiana and became a resident of
East Baton Rouge Parish for the remainder of his life; he began his career as a special
education teacher and taught at the middle school level for many years; and
WHEREAS, in the spring of 2000, he entered the Lambda Kappa Chapter of Omega
Phi Psi Fraternity and remained a loyal member; he pursued a law degree from Southern
University Law Center, graduating in 2003; and

- WHEREAS, Kwame continued to be a consummate public servant while practicing
 law; after volunteering for the NAACP as a college student, he was elected to serve at the
 Baton Rouge Local Chapter in 2004; in the fall of 2005, he was hired by the national office
 of the NAACP to serve as the Louisiana state director; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Kwame remained passionate for the education and advancement of the 6 Baton Rouge youth community; he established The Achievement Academy, a tutoring and 7 leadership program for youth, through which he introduced young adults to programs and 8 opportunities that they were previously unaware of so as to enrich the minds of new 9 generations; and
- WHEREAS, Kwame I. Asante leaves to cherish his memory and legacy his daughter,
 Zori Chaney; his mother, Lillian Franklin; his grandmother, Lucy Glover; aunts, Sarah
 Jackson and Glenda Taylor; uncle, Gregory Franklin; and a host of cousins, relatives, and
 friends; and
- WHEREAS, Kwame I. Asante truly cared for his community and devoted his life to
 the service of future generations; his career as an educator, lawyer, and NAACP leader have
 left a truly inspiring legacy that will live on forever in the achievements of those who have
 benefitted from his many works; he will be deeply missed.
