**Abstract:** Replaces the words "sex offender" with tier classifications on the driver's license or identification card of a registered sex offender and removes the one-year period of validity.

<u>Present law</u> provides a La. driver's license issued to a registered sex offender shall contain a restriction code which declares that the license holder is a sex offender, and <u>present law</u> requires the secretary of the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections to comply with the provisions of present law.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 32:412(I)) requires that the driver's license of a registered sex offender include the words "sex offender" written in orange.

<u>Present law</u> also requires that a registered sex offender obtain a special identification card that contains a restriction code declaring that the holder is a sex offender.

<u>Present law</u> provides that when the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections issues a driver's license pursuant to <u>present law</u>, the license is only valid for one year from the date of issuance.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 40:1321(J)) provides that the identification card shall include the words "sex offender" in all capital letters written in orange and shall be valid for a period of one year from the date of issuance. <u>Present law</u> further provides that the special identification card shall be carried on the person at all times by the individual required to register as a sex offender.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>. <u>Proposed law</u> replaces the words "sex offender" with tier classifications on the driver's license and identification card of a registered sex offender.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the T1 classification is for persons required to register for 15 years; T2 classification is for persons required to register for 25 years; and T3 classification is for persons required to register for life.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that an identification card shall be obtained if the person required to register as a sex offender does not have a driver's license.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes the one-year period of validity for the registered sex offender's identification card and driver's license and <u>proposed law</u> removes any <u>present law</u> provision referencing the one year period of validity.
