 Provides relative to individual graduation plans and high school curriculum options. (gov sig)

Proposed legislation requires a student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to obtain the written approval of the student's parent or legal guardian before determining an alternative path to graduation for the student. Requires the written approval of a parent or legal guardian for a student to change from one career major to another. Requires the school counselor to meet with a student's parent or legal guardian prior to revising a student's individual graduation plan. Requires each school with an approved career major program to conduct an annual informational meeting for 8th grade students' parents and guardians regarding graduation requirements and curriculum choices. Requires the Department of Education (LDE) to develop materials regarding high school curriculum frameworks, graduation requirements, and relevant postsecondary education and career opportunities, and to provide these materials to each school for use in the annual meetings. Effective upon governor's signature.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There will be an indeterminable increase in costs and workloads for schools to hold informational meetings with parents regarding graduation requirements and curriculum choices, and for counselors to meet with parents or guardians regarding a revision of a student's individual graduation plan for a career major (Jumpstart Pathway). The proposed law will not result in additional state costs, as the Department of Education (LDE) has adequate capacity to fulfill the requirement that it develop certain materials for use in the annual informational meetings outlined in the proposed law.
