3	corresponding rules and regulations. The cost of such contracts shall be considered
4	administrative expenses.
5	F. Each grant recipient shall be required to provide matching funds unless
6	the review panel recommends waiving the match requirement.
7	G. Upon committee approval of the rules, the office shall begin accepting
8	applications. The applications shall include the following, at a minimum:
9	(1) The amount of grant funding requested.
10	(2) The amount and proposed source of funding for the required match.
11	(3) Proposals for repairs, improvements, or consolidation with neighboring
12	systems.
13	(4) Proposals for ensuring the financial sustainability and compliance of the
14	systems, including proposals for increasing rates paid by users of the system based
15	on a fair assessment of the system to comparable systems.
16	H. The review panel's funding recommendations to the committee shall
17	include:
18	(1) Recommendations for utilization of existing resources including the
19	Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund, Clean Water State Revolving Fund, and
20	Community Water Enrichment and Other Improvements Fund.
21	(2) Certification that the local governing authority that operates the system
22	either utilized funding received pursuant to the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery
23	Fund of the American Rescue Act Plan of 2021 as the source of funding for the
24	required match or had legitimate cause that precluded the use of those funds for the
25	match.
26	I. Upon approval of any funding recommendations, the committee may
27	appropriate monies from the fund to the system or local governing authority that
28	operates the system.
29	J. No money shall be expended from the fund without approval of the
30	committee.
31	$\overline{K}$ . The provisions of R.S. 39:72.1(A) shall not apply to monies appropriated
32	from the fund pursuant to this Section."
