HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 40

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: Directs the Department of Economic Development and the State Board of Commerce and Industry to suspend certain tax incentives, subsidies, and other public financial support for certain utility scale solar projects

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To direct the Department of Economic Development and the State Board of Commerce and
3	Industry to suspend the Louisiana Industrial Ad Valorem Tax Exemption Program
4	under LAC 13:1 et seq. and any other tax incentives, subsidies, and other public
5	financial support as it relates to utility scale solar projects that are not subject to
6	review and approval by the Louisiana Public Service Commission and the council
7	of the city of New Orleans.
8	WHEREAS, increased solar development activity in Louisiana requires increased
9	leasing of land in Louisiana, which involves private landowners and available farmland; and
10	WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of leases requested by solar developers can
11	provide a significant risk to landowner's future property rights and to future use of available
12	farmland, including but not limited to the responsibilities for equipment removal upon
13	default or termination of a lease; and
14	WHEREAS, because of the lack of historical prevalence, solar leasing has not been
15	provided similar legislative guidance and legal parameters as oil, gas, pipelines, timber, and
16	other types of land use activities in Louisiana; and

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1 WHEREAS, solar development speculation and leases of land in Louisiana are 2 increasing to the point of concern for what it might do to long-term stability of both 3 farmland and the electric grid; and

4 WHEREAS, the Louisiana Public Service Commission has an existing process in 5 place for regulated utilities to procure solar resources and other resources under the rules and 6 regulations established by the Louisiana Public Service Commission, which are established 7 to protect Louisiana citizens, ensure grid operations and reliability, and protect the public 8 interest; and

9 WHEREAS, the proliferation of solar resources outside of a structured and regulated 10 planning process can create reliability and stability issues for the electric grid, as seen 11 recently in other states during recent extreme weather events; and

12 WHEREAS, Louisiana citizens and businesses would best be served by an orderly 13 and regulated development of solar resources that protects landowners, electric utility 14 customers, and the electric grid; and

15 WHEREAS, solar developers have a history of relying heavily on public subsidies 16 and tax incentives to provide financially viable products and projects; and

17 WHEREAS, there is a need to determine whether the granting of tax incentives or 18 subsidies to proposed solar developments is consistent with good economic and public 19 policy.

20 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 21 direct the Department of Economic Development and the State Board of Commerce and 22 Industry to suspend LAC 13:1 et seq. and any other tax incentives, subsidies, and other 23 public financial support as it relates to utility scale solar projects that are not subject to 24 review and approval by the Louisiana Public Service Commission and the council of the city 25 of New Orleans.

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the 27 secretary of the Department of Economic Development and the chairman of the State Board 28 of Commerce and Industry.

- The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Commerce</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:
- 1. Make technical changes.
- 2. Add a provision to include the State Board of Commerce and Industry as an entity being directed to suspend the Louisiana Industrial Ad Valorem Tax Exemption Program and other tax incentives, subsidies, and other public financial support relative to certain utility scale solar projects.
- 3. Add a provision to transmit a copy of the resolution to the secretary of the Louisiana Department of Economic Development.
- 4. Add a provision to transmit a copy of the resolution to the chairman of the State Board of Commerce and Industry.
