- (2) If a person fails to appear before the court on the date given in this notice and does not contact the court in advance to request an alternative date, a warrant may be issued for the person's arrest, and the person may face sanctions by the court.
- (3) If a person is unable to make a payment toward any fine, cost, or fee ordered by the court, a request may be made for payment alternatives including but not limited to any or all of the following:
 - (a) A reduction of the amount owed.
 - (b) A payment plan.
- (c) Community service.
 - (d) Any documentation or information the person wants the court to consider in determining their ability to pay shall be brought to court.
 - D. Receipt of a traffic citation that includes the notice in accordance with Subsection C of this section shall be deemed to have satisfied the notice requirements set forth in Code of Criminal Procedure Article 202(H)."
