Appropriates supplemental funding and provides for means of financing substitutions and other budgetary adjustments for Fiscal Year 2020-2021. Provides for net increases (decreases) as follows: State General Fund (Direct) by \$236,243,896; Interagency Transfers by (\$34,919,612); Fees & Self-generated Revenues by \$37,344,810; Statutory Dedications by (\$536,951,541); and Federal Funds by (\$195,489,249).

Appropriates \$27,043,431 of State General Fund (Direct) of nonrecurring revenue out of the surplus from Fiscal Year 2019-20 for the Unfunded Accrued Liability (UAL) in state retirement systems.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any appropriation to a local government entity contained in Act 45 of the 2020 Second Extraordinary Session for which a valid cooperative endeavor agreement exists between the entity and the state treasury on June 30, 2021, shall be deemed a bona fide obligation through Dec. 31, 2021.
